

We the undersigned residents of the territory embraced in the proposed village of St. Paul Park duly appointed to act as inspectors and judges of an election duly called and held on the 16th. day of October 1909 at Gilmores Hall in the town of Newport in said county and state for the purpose of voting upon the question of whether the proposed village of St. Paul Park should be incorporated or not, do hereby STATE, CERTIFY AND RETURN; that C. Bauman one of the persons named and appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of said county as one of the inspectors and judges of said election did not appear at the opening of the polls nor was he present thereat at anytime during the time said election was being held; that J. R. Collins was duly appointed by the qualified electors present thereat as inspector and judge of said election and he acted as such in the place of said C. Bauman; that on the 16th. day of October 1909 at Gilmores Hall in said town, county and state between the hours of nine (9) o'clock in the forenoon and five (5) o'clock in the afternoon of that day said election was duly held; that we have canvassed the ballots cast thereat and the number cast both for and against said proposition; that the number cast for incorporation were forty-nine (49) and the number cast against the incorporation were thirteen (13).

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That an election will be held at Gilmore's Hall in the Town of Newport on the 16th day of October, A.D., 1909, upon the question of whether the territory described in the annexed petition of the voters, residing within said territory, praying for the incorporation of said territory therein described, into a village to be known as St. Paul Park, a copy of which said petition is hereto annexed and made a part of this Notice.

C. H. GILMORE, O. HAUGE and C. BAUMAN, residents of said territory will act as judges of said election, and they shall appoint two persons clerks of the same, and said election shall be conducted the same, as far as practicable, in accordance with the laws regulating the election of town officers. The polls will be open at nine o'clock A.M. of said day and close at five o'clock P.M. The ballots shall bear the words:

Resolution adopted Sept. 15, 1909.

TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA:

The undersigned electors and residents upon the lands hereinafter described hereby petition your Honorable Board to call an election and appoint a time and place when and where the electors actually residing upon the lands hereinafter described may vote for or against the incorporation of said district and the people thereof as a village under the Revised Laws of Minnesota of 1905 and the laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto in such case made and provided.

And your petitioners represent and declare that no part of said territory is within the limits of any incorporated city or village; that all of said district and territory is in the county of Washington in the state of Minnesota; that a portion thereof has been platted into lots and blocks under the name of "St. Paul Park", and constitutes Divisions two(2), three(3), four(4), five (5), and part of Division one (1) therein; that another part of said territory has been platted into lots and blocks under the name of "College Addition"; that another part of said territory has been platted into lots and blocks under the name of "Pullman Addition" to St. Paul Park; that another part of said territory has been platted into lots and blocks under the name of "College Hill Addition" to St. Paul Park; that another part of said territory has been platted into lots and blocks under the name of "DeCamps Addition" to St. Paul Park; that another part of said territory has been platted into lots and blocks under the name of "St. Paul Park Company's Re-arrangement of Block Sixty-three(63) of Division two (2)" to St. Paul Park; that said plats and each of them have been duly and legally certified according to the laws of this state and filed and are of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for said Washington County in Book "B" of Town Plats on pages 44, 57, 72, 69, 43, 82, 74, 81, 52, and 86, respectively; and reference is hereby made to said plats of said divisions and additions and to each of them; that the lands adjacent to said platted portion of said territory constitutes the unplatted portion thereof and adjoins the said platted part and is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to village government; that said

territory is situate in sections one (1), two (2), eleven (11), twelve (12), thirteen (13), and fourteen (14) in Township twenty-seven (27) north of Range twenty-two (22) west, and sections seven (7) and eighteen (18) in Township twenty-seven (27) north of Range twenty-one (21) west.

That said district and territory is described and bounded as follows;

Commencing at a point where the south (S.) line of Government Lot two (2) in section Two (2) Town twenty-seven (27) north of Range twenty-two (22) west meets the Mississippi River;

thence east along said south line of said lot and along the south line of the North Half (N.½) of Section one (1) in said town and range last named, to the Northeasterly (N.E.ly) line of the right of way of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad;

thence southeasterly along said northeasterly line of aforesaid right of way to the south (S.) line of the North Half (N.½) of the Southeast quarter (S.E.¼) of said section one (1);

thence east along said south line last named to the East (E.) line of said section one (1);

thence south along said east line last named and along the East (E.) line of said section twelve (12) to the Northeasterly (N.E.ly) line of the aforesaid right of way of said railroad;

thence southeasterly along said northeasterly line of said railroad right of way to the East (E.) line of the West Half (W.½) of section seven (7) in Township twenty-seven (27) north of Range twenty-one (21) west;

thence south along said east (E.) line of last named to the south (S.) line of said section seven (7);

thence west along said south (S.) line last named to the Northwest (N.W.) corner of the East Half (E.½) of the Northwest quarter (N.W.¼) of Section eighteen (18) in Township twenty-seven (27) north of Range twenty-one (21) west;

thence south along the west (W.) line of the East Half (E.½) of the Northwest Quarter (N.W.¼) of said section eighteen (18), to the south (S.) line of the last said Northwest Quarter (N.W.¼);

thence west along the south (S.) line last named and along the south (S.) line of the Northeast Quarter (N.E.¼) of section thirteen (13) in Town twenty-seven (27) north of range twenty-two (22) west, to the westerly (W.ly) line of the right of way of Chicago, Burlington and Northern Railroad;

thence northwesterly along the westerly (W.ly) line of last said railroad right of way, to the south (S.) line of Fourteenth (14th) Avenue in said Division four (4) of St. Paul Park as shown by the said plat thereof;

thence westerly along the south (S.) line of said Fourteenth (14th) Avenue and along the south (S.) line of said Fourteenth (14th) Avenue produced to the Mississippi River, to the Easterly (E.ly) bank of said river;

thence in a northerly direction along the easterly bank of the Mississippi River to the place of beginning;

all being in Town twenty-seven (27) north of Ranges twenty-one (21) and twenty-two (22) west.

That the said territory contains a resident population of not more than three thousand(3000) nor less than two hundred (200), and is to-wit, Nine hundred and forty-three (943).

The district, sections, parts of sections, divisions and parts of divisions, additions and parts of additions, sought hereby to be embraced and included in said corporation are hereby sought to be incorporated and is described as hereinbefore set forth; and reference is hereby made to said plats of said additions and divisions on file and of record as aforesaid and to each of them.

The boundaries of the territory sought to be incorporated are as hereinbefore set forth.

That the quantity of land embraced in said proposed village is Fourteen hundred (1400) acres, and reference is hereby made for greater accuracy to the United States Government Survey of said territory.

That the name we desire for said proposed village is "St. Paul Park", and the number of persons actually residing in said territory has been ascertained by your petitioners and under their direction by a census taken of the resident population of said territory on the 29th day of July, 1909, and the number of persons so ascertained is Nine hundred and forty-three (943); and the action of your Honorable Board in the premises is hereby requested; and your petitioners will ever pray.
