



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, HARRY H. PETERSON, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute and particularly by authority of Section 110, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, do hereby constitute and appoint Joseph M. Donahue of St. Paul, Minnesota, as Law Assistant in the office of the Attorney General for the period commencing January 2, 1935, and to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General and until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law. I hereby fix said Joseph M. Donahue's compensation in the sum of One Hundred Fifty (\$150) Dollars per month, to be paid from and out of the appropriation made for the Attorney General's Office from the State Emergency Relief Administration funds.
