

TO THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, MINNESOTA.

We the undersigned do hereby respectfully represent and show to the Mayor and Common Council above named the following facts, to-wit:

That we are residents and legal voters of that portion of Crane's Addition in the Township of Lansing in Mower County, Minnesota lying and being south of Sullivan Street in said Crane Addition.

That we desire to have all that portion of Crane's Addition in the Township of Lansing in Mower County, Minnesota, lying and being south of the center line of Sullivan Street in said Addition as the same appears of record in Book Four of Plats, on page thirty-four, in the Register of Deeds office in and for the County of Mower and State of Minnesota, and including the south half of said Sullivan Street to be annexed to the City of Austin, Minnesota; and we do hereby petition and request that an election be called and held for the determination of such proposed annexation. That said territory proposed to be so annexed to the City of Austin is bounded on the south by Mitchell Street, on the west by the center line of Oak Street, on the north by the center line of Sullivan Street, and on the east by Cipra Street as the same appears on the plat of Crane's Addition in the Township of Lansing in Mower County, Minnesota, which said plat is recorded in the Register of Deeds office for Mower County, Minnesota in Book Four (4) of Plats, on page Thirty-four (34).

That the territory so proposed to be annexed contains approximately Twenty-two (22) acres of land.

That on the 26th day of August, 1925, a census of the inhabitants residing on the territory that is proposed to be annexed to the City of Austin, Minnesota, was taken, from which it was found that there were 347 inhabitants residing in said territory.

RESOLUTION NO. 1318.

Relative to the annexation of a portion of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing, to the City of Austin.

WHEREAS a verified petition, signed by five of the legal voters of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing, Lower County, Minnesota, has been presented to the Common Council of the City of Austin, requesting that a special election be held to determine whether or not a certain portion of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing be annexed to the City of Austin; and

WHEREAS the Common Council has examined said petition and said territory itself, and finds that the territory comprised in the petition, to-wit: that portion of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing lying south of the center of Sullivan Street and comprising Blocks One, Two, and Three thereof, includes, according to the census duly taken, a resident population of 547 people; that said territory is not included in any incorporated city or village, and that no part of said territory is more than one and one-half miles from the present limits of the City of Austin, which it adjoins; and finally, that said petition correctly sets forth the boundaries of such territory, the quantity of land embraced therein, and the number of actual residents thereon; and that said petition is in all respects in accordance with statute.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED By the Common Council of the City of Austin that said petition be and the same is hereby received and placed upon file.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of said petition, together with a notice, a form of which is hereinafter set forth, shall be posted forthwith in three public places within that portion of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing south of the center of Sullivan Street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an election to determine whether or not said territory shall be annexed to the City of Austin shall be held on the 20th day of September, 1935, at the Union Church on the North side of Mitchell Street, located on Lot 32, in Block 1, of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing, which is not less than ten nor more than thirty days after posting the notice.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following named inspectors, to-wit: Alfred Smith, Mrs. Henry Appel, and Clarence Sweazey, who are residents of the territory proposed to be annexed, shall act as judges of election and conduct the same as far as practicable in accordance with the laws regulating the election of town officers. Only voters residing within the territory proposed to be annexed shall be entitled to vote. The ballots shall bear the words "For Annexation, Yes ____, No ____", with a space after each of the last two words, in one of which spaces the voter shall make a cross to indicate his choice.

Immediately after such election, the inspectors shall canvass the ballots and forthwith make and file with the City Recorder of the City of Austin a certificate stating the time and place of holding said election, that they have canvassed the ballots cast thereat, and the number of ballots cast for and against said proposition. Said certificate shall be signed and verified by all of said

inspectors, to the effect that the statements therein contained are true.

The form of notice to be attached to the petition will read as follows:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 20th day of September, 1935, at the Union Church on the north side of Mitchell Street, located on Lot 38, in Block 1, of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing, Lower County, Minnesota, an election will be held for the purpose of determining whether or not that portion of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing which lies south of the center of Sullivan Street in said Addition, and comprising Blocks One, Two and Three of said Addition, together with the adjacent streets and alleys, shall be annexed to the City of Austin. Said polls shall open at 6 o'clock P. M. and close at 9 o'clock P. M. Only legal voters residing within the above territory shall be entitled to vote at said election. The inspectors who shall act as judges of said election are Alfred Smith, Mrs. Henry Appel and Clarence Sweazey.

ELECTION INSPECTORS' CERTIFICATE

We, the undersigned inspectors duly appointed by Resolution No. 1315 of the Common Council of the City of Austin, Lower County, Minnesota, passed September 6, 1935, to supervise the election provided for in said resolution, to determine whether or not that portion of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing lying south of the center of Sullivan Street, comprising Blocks One, Two and Three of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing, Lower County, Minnesota, shall be annexed to said City of Austin, hereby certify as follows:

1. That said election was duly held on September 20, 1935, at the Union Church on the north side of Mitchell Street, located on Lot 32, in Block 1, of said Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing, said polls opening at 6 P. M. and closing at 9 P. M.

2. That we have canvassed the ballots cast thereat.

3. That there were delivered to us 150 ballots; that there were 3 ballots spoiled; that there were 97 ballots cast in favor of said proposition; that there were 44 ballots cast against said proposition; that there were 106 ballots returned by us to the City Recorder of the City of Austin.

ORDINANCE NO. 554.

Annexing a portion of Crane's Addition located in the Town of Lansing, to the City of Austin.

WHEREAS a verified petition was duly filed with the Common Council of the City of Austin, requesting that a special election be held to determine whether or not that portion of Crane's Addition in the Town of Lansing lying south of the center line of Sullivan Street be annexed to the City of Austin; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to said petition, Resolution No. 1315 of the City of Austin was duly passed, providing the time and place of holding a special election and appointing inspectors to act as judges thereat; and

WHEREAS the inspectors have duly made report to the City Recorder of the City of Austin by certificate showing that 27 resident electors voted in favor of annexation and 44 resident electors voted against annexation;

NOW THEREFORE, the Common Council of the City of Austin do ordain:

Section I. That portion of Crane's Addition located in the Town of Lansing, lying south of the center of Sullivan Street, be annexed to and made a part of the City of Austin and designated as Crane's Second Addition to the City of Austin.

Section II. This ordinance shall go into full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
