4 I do hereby certify

5 that on the 25th February 1936, a petition and notice, signed by sixty voters of the Town
6 ship of Colverton, Minnesota, residing in said township, more than fifty of which voters
7 resided outside of the village of Colverton, in said town, the remaining residing in said
8 village, stating that the question of the separation of such town for all purposes from
9 the village of Colverton, in said town, would be voted upon at the next annual election
10 and town meeting in said town was filed with the town clerk of said town, Raymond Paulson.

11 Thereupon I caused to be posted at the regular places in said town designated by
12 the voters of said town at the 1935 town meeting, as the best public places in said
13 town suitable for the posting of town notices and erected and maintained by said town
14 as such posting places, a notice of annual town meeting, of such town to be held on
15 Tuesday the 19th March 1936 at nine o'clock A.M. for the transaction of such business
16 as might regularly come before it; that a supervisor would be elected to fill the place
17 of the existing and actual supervisor whose term expired that day, a town clerk, treasurer,
18 assessor justice of the peace and constable and that said notice also contained a notice
19 as follows, "Notice is hereby given that the following notice signed by more than fifty
20 voters of said town ~~residing within the county of Minnesota~~, to wit, "Notice that the
21 question that the separation of the town of Colverton, Ilklin county, Minnesota for all
22 purposes from the village of Colverton in said county, will be voted upon at the next, 1936
23 annual town meeting of said town of Colverton, appointed to be held at the school house
24 in the village of Colverton, Minnesota on Tuesday the tenth day of March 1936 at nine
25 o'clock A.M., will be voted upon at said meeting.

26 Thereupon caused to be prepared blank ballots for the electors who desired to vote
27 upon the question of such separation, as follows: Shall Colverton Township separate for
28 all purposes from the village of Colverton Yes
29 Please place cross opposite your ballot No

30 That at said town meeting fifty eight votes were cast of which fifty three
31 ballots were cast "yes", four "No" and one was spoiled.

32 Thereupon at the close of said canvass the supervisor of said town and
33 moderator at said meeting announced the result of said canvass to the voters and
34 said town was duly declared separated from said village of Colverton by the vote of
35 the electors of said town, at said annual town meeting.

1 From the question and resolution of separating from said village of
2 Elverton, were deposited in a separate box and a regular poll list kept of the
3 electors voting thereon and that ballots were duly counted, canvassed and the
4 result ascertained, declared and certified, in like manner as in the case of ballots
5 cast for officers of said town.

6 This report is made supplemental to and as a part of the report of said
7 election heretofore certified to the county auditor of Wilkin county, Minnesota
8 17th March 1936 and the reason a further and fuller one of said town meeting election
9 was not made at said time was that the undersigned and said auditor were unable to
10 procure blank reports in that behalf.
