

Know all men by these presents, that I, Harry H. Peterson, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute and particularly by authority of Section 110, 1934 Supplement, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, do hereby constitute and appoint Humphrey Barton of St. Paul, Minnesota, as Special Assistant Attorney General to prosecute actions on behalf of the State of Minnesota pursuant to the provisions of Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 4291 (Workmen's Compensation Act) against the third party or parties involved in the cases of Joseph Twaddle, deceased employe, vs. State of Minnesota, Department of Conservation, Division of Game and Fish, employer, Industrial Commission file number 133174 and Hilma C. Lofquist, widow of Claf P. Lofquist, deceased state employe, vs. State of Minnesota, Department of Conservation, Division of Game and Fish, Industrial Commission file number 390252. I hereby fix the compensation of said Humphrey Barton in each case to be at such amount, if any, as is provided for in the provisions of said Section 4291. Said appointment shall commence on the 1st day of April, 1936, and shall continue until the termination of the litigation above referred to.




