In conformity with instructions on General Land Office Form for application for survey of land not previously surveyed by the Federal Government, I am writing you of my intention to apply for a survey of Bird Island in Bay Lake, Crow Wing County, situated in Section 11, Township 43 N., Range 30 W., 6th Meridian of Minnesota.

The instructions state that owners of land opposite to the island in question, and the Attorney General, and Secretary of State of the State must informed " that it is contended that the land, the survey of which is to be applied for, is public land of the United States and subject to survey and disposition as such, and that any protests against the proposed survey should be filed with the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Washington, D. C. within thirty days of the date receipt of this notice.
