GOVERNOR'S ORDER NUMBER 24, EXTENDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION
TO RACCOON IN THE STATE OF MINNESOTA DURING THE YEAR 1936.


Whereas, it has been represented to the Director of Game and Fish that raccoon are in danger of undue depletion in the State of Minnesota, and

Whereas, the Director of Game and Fish has investigated and has presented me with the results of his investigation and has recommended that protection be given raccoon in all of the counties in the State of Minnesota during the year 1936, to prevent their undue depletion.


Now, therefore, I, Hjalmar Petersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of and pursuant to authority vested in me by Section 5640, G. S. 1923, do hereby order that raccoon may be taken in all of the counties of the State of Minnesota, in the manner and under the conditions prescribed by law, between the dates of November 10th and December 1st, 1936, both dates inclusive.

This order shall remain in force until the close of the 1937 regular Session of the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, unless sooner revoked or modified.
