

AFFIDAVIT OF PUBLICATION.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE NO. 30.

An Ordinance Extending the Present Boundaries of the Village of Biwabik and Annexing to said Village Certain Land Commonly Known as the C. J. Eklund Property.

The Village council of the village of Biwabik, in St. Louis County, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Annexation.—Pursuant to and in conformity with section 707 of the revised laws of Minnesota, 1905, the present corporate limits and village boundaries of the village of Biwabik, Saint Louis County, Minnesota, are hereby extended so as to include all that piece and parcel of land outlined, bounded and described in section 2 hereof and same is hereby annexed to, declared to be an addition to, and a part of the village of Biwabik as effectually as if the same had been originally a part thereof.

Section 2. Description of Property.—The land hereby annexed being adjacent to and abutting upon the present corporate limits of the village of Biwabik is described as follows to-wit:

That portion of the NW ¼ of the NW ¼ of Section 11, Township 58, Range 16, North of the 4th Principal Meridian, Saint Louis County, Minnesota, more specifically described, outlined and bounded as follows, to-wit: a strip of land on the extension of Canton Avenue commencing at a point one hundred twenty-five (125) feet south of the SE corner of block numbered fifty-five (55) of the village of Biwabik according to the recorded plat thereof now on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for St. Louis County, (namely, at the SE corner of Outlot numbered two (2) of said village) to make a direct continuation of the West Line of Canton Avenue running in a southerly direction to a point of intersection with the northeasterly line of the right-of-way of the Duluth & Iron Range Railway, thence in a northwesterly direction along the along the northeasterly line of said right-of-way to a point where said right-of-way intersects a line drawn one hundred twenty-five (125) feet south of said southerly line of block fifty-five (55) parallel to said southerly line of block fifty-five (55) [namely the southwest corner of said outlot numbered two (2)] thence in an easterly direction along a line drawn parallel to said southerly line of block fifty-five (55) one hundred feet south thereof, [namely, the southerly line of Outlot numbered two (2)] to the point of commencement, being a triangular strip of land bounded on the north, by Outlot numbered two (2), on the east by a line which is the direct continuation of the west line of Canton Avenue and on the southwest by the northeasterly line of the Duluth & Iron Range Railway.

Section 3. Outlot.—The land described, outlined and bounded in Section 2 of this ordinance, is hereby designated and shall hereafter be known as "Outlot No. 3" of the village of Biwabik.

Section 4. Certified copy to be filed.—The village clerk is hereby ordered and directed to cause a certified copy of this ordinance to be filed with the secretary of state.

Section 5. When to take effect.—This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and publication and the filing of a certified copy thereof with the secretary of state.
