


KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, WILLIAM S. ERVIN, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Section 114, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, do hereby constitute and appoint ROBERT G. FLYNN, of St. Paul, Minnesota, as ATTORNEY for the Examiner-in-Charge of the liquidation of closed banks, of the Division of Banks, Department of Commerce, of the State of Minnesota; and I hereby fix his compensation in the sum of Two Hundred Seventy-five (\$275.00) Dollars per month, to be paid by the said Examiner-in-Charge of the liquidation of closed banks. Said appointment to commence on January 1, 1937, and to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General and until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this thirty-first day of December 1936.


