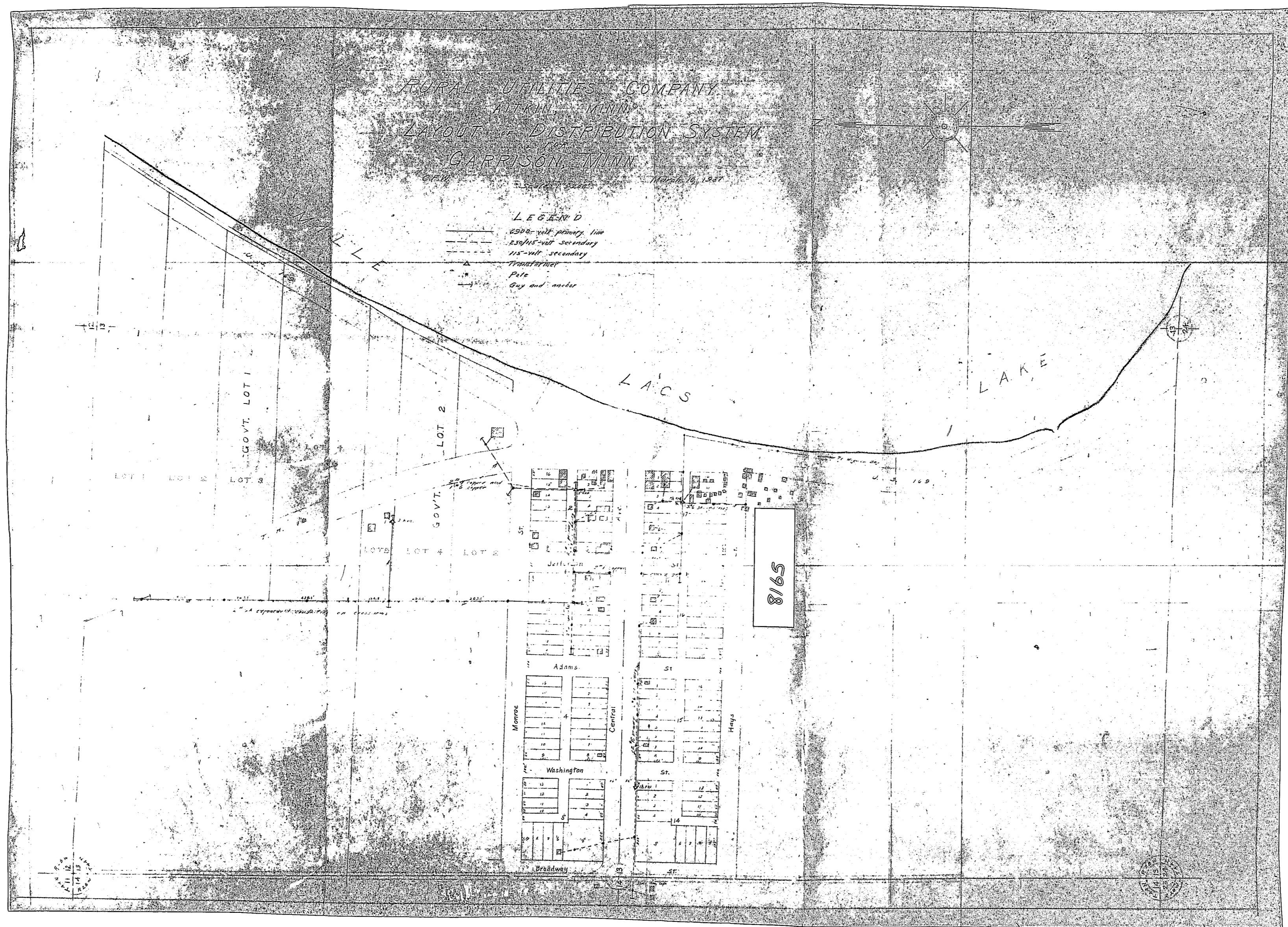





Commissioner Chrysler offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:


WHEREAS, the County Board for and in the County of Crow Wing, State of Minnesota, having been petitioned to call an election for the determination of the incorporation of a Village to be known as Garrison, and having examined the petition and having found the requirements provided for by law, met and fulfilled, do hereby approve the said petition and do hereby order an election to be held on the 29th day of April, 1937, between the hours of nine o'clock A. M. and five o'clock P. M., at the Midland Hotel, a building located on Lots 7 and 8, Block 2, Midland, according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for the County of Crow Wing, State of Minnesota, said building being located in the limits of the proposed territory to be incorporated.

And it is further ordered that copies of said petition with a notice fixing the time and place of said election be posted in three (3) public places within the proposed limits of the territory to be incorporated.


Commissioner Chrysler offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Government Lots ONE (1), TWO (2), THREE (3) and FOUR (4), the West Half of the Northwest Quarter ( $W\frac{1}{2}$  of  $NW\frac{1}{4}$ ) and the West half of the Southwest quarter ( $W\frac{1}{2}$  of  $SW\frac{1}{4}$ ) all in Section THIRTEEN (13) Township Forty-Four (44) North, Range Twenty-eight (28) west, also the Southeast quarter ( $SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Northeast Quarter ( $NE\frac{1}{4}$ ) and the Northeast quarter ( $NE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Southeast quarter ( $SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section Fourteen (14) in township Forty-four (44) North, Range Twenty-eight (28) west, All in Crow Wing County and State of Minnesota.

That said described lands include a platted area, to-wit: The plat of Midland as shown of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for the county of Crow Wing, Minnesota.
