TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Notice is hereby given that the above named John T. Lyons has
appealed, and does hereby appeal, to said Court from the Declaration
made by the State Canvassing Board, declaring Stafford King to be
elected to the office of State Auditor of the State of Minnesota,
and that he hereby contests said declaration and said claimed election
of said King.

That the said John T. Lyons contentions herein, specifies the
following points upon which said contest and appeal will be made,
to-wit:

1. That said John T. Lyons is now, and for many years has been
a citizen and resident of LeCenter in LeCenter County, Minnesota, and
that as such he had, and has, the right to vote for or against State
officers of said State, including candidates for the office of State
Auditor of said State.

2. That he was a candidate for election to said office of State
auditor at the recent state election held November 6th, 1874.

3. That said Stafford King was also a candidate for said office
of State Auditor at said election, and that upon canvassing the
votes subsequent to said election, the said State Canvassing Board
has found and declared Stafford King was, and is, elected to said
office by majority of 648 votes over and above the total vote or
votes received by said John T. Lyons.

4. That said Declaration and the result declared thereby, are
wrong and unlawful, and that in fact and in law the said John T. Lyons
was duly elected by the votes of a plurality of the qualified voters

of Minnesota did vote in said election for said office.

S. That said declaration was and is erroneous and unlawful
for the following reasons among others, to-wit:

(a) That in the first election district of the 7th ward of the
City of Minneapolis, Hennepin County, in said State the said John T.
Lyons received at least 100 more votes at said election than have
been returned to said State Canvassing Board, or counted by them in their
total result; that the contestant herein is informed and believes that
in many other election precincts of said State, like errors have
been made, and that not less than 1,000 votes cast for the contestant
herein in said election have not been counted for him, as credited
to him in the ascertainment and determination of the result of said
election.

(b) That in the election district known and designated as Woods
Township in Chippewa County, Minnesota, at least 20 votes cast for
the contestant herein were counted for said Stafford King and so
counted and declared by said State Canvassing Board, making a wrongful
difference of at least 40 votes in the total as ascertained and
declared by said Canvassing Board; and that the contestant is informed
and believes that in many other election districts throughout said
State, similar and greater errors were made, with the result that at
least 1,000 votes actually marked and cast for this contestant in
said election were counted for said Stafford King in the result
declared by said Canvassing Board.

(c) That the contestant herein is informed and believes that in
the 1st election district of the 1st ward of the City of New Ulm in
Brown County, Minnesota, the total of all votes cast for candidates
for the office of State Auditor, or computed and declared by said
Canvassing Board exceeded in number the total of votes legally cast by
actual voters of said district; and that similar errors were made in
other election districts throughout said State with the result that the
number or total of actual votes cast for this contestant at said
election is not fully and fairly shown by said declaration of said
Canvassing Board, and that a greater and larger number of votes than
were actually cast for said Stafford King is thereby shown or

declared.

(d) That the contestants herein is informed and believes, that in every election district in said State, at least one more vote than has been included in the totals ascertained and declared by said Canvassing Board, has been cast for him; and that in every election district in said State, contestants is also informed and believes that said Stefford King received at least one less vote than was included in the totals ascertained and declared by said State Canvassing Board.

(e) That by reason of the above and other sufficient errors, it has been made to appear that said Stefford King is elected to said office, while in fact the said John T. Lyons was duly elected to said office, is qualified to assume said office, and has the right to be declared elected thereto.
