WHEREAS, Minnesota has achieved national distinction through the traffic safety program carried on by the Minnesota Public Safety Committee and affiliated organizations with the support of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Public Safety Committee in 1936 conducted an intensive drive to reduce traffic deaths during September, the most hazardous traffic month of the year; and


WHEREAS, the campaign was successful and the traffic death rate was reduced in comparison with the same month in 1935; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Public Safety Committee again will conduct a special campaign to "Make September the Safest Month" instead of a month of tragedy for driver and pedestrian;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer A. Benson, Governor of Minnesota, urge the public to cooperate to the fullest possible extent in this laudable effort to make our highways safe.

FURTHER, I request that all governmental officials, the courts, and peace enforcement authorities take special notice of the campaign and make a united effort to bring about a safety record of note during September, 1937.
