CERTIFICATE of Inspectors.

County of Crow Wing: We, the undersigned inspectors, duly appointed as such and to be judges of the election for the determination of the incorporation of certain territory in said Crow Wing County, under the name of Crosby, duly appointed as such inspectors, and judges of such election by resolution of the county Board of said Crow Wing County adopted on the 7th day of June 1910, do hereby certify:

That at the time and place specified in the notice of such election duly issued by said county board on the date last above mentioned, to-wit, - at Spalding's Hotel, being a building situate on Lots 14, 15 and 16, Block 9 of the platted townsite of Crosby in said county, according to the plat of said townsite duly filed in the office of the Register of Deeds of said county, said place being within the limits of the proposed village of Crosby as shown by the petition for such election, on the 2nd day of July 1910 an election was held and conducted.

That the undersigned inspectors, so duly appointed, acted as judges of such election after taking and subscribing the prescribed oath of office according to law.

That the polls for said election were duly opened on the said 2nd day of July 1910 and were ~~thereafter~~ kept open continuously until 7 o'clock in the afternoon of said day at which time the said polls were closed by due proclamation according to law.

That at said election so held and conducted the total number of ballots cast was 61, of which 57 were then and there found and declared by the undersigned inspectors to be in the affirmative and in favor of incorporation, and out of said total number of ballots so cast 2 were then and there found and declared by the undersigned inspectors to be in the negative and against incorporation, and a majority of 55 ballots in the affirmative and in favor of incorporation were then and there found and declared by the undersigned inspectors.

That upon closing of said polls on the 2nd day of July 1910 as aforesaid, the undersigned inspectors did forthwith publicly canvass without adjournment or interruption the said ballots until the same was com-

pleted; that said canvass was conducted by taking one ballot at a time from the ballot box and counting until the number so taken from the ballot box equaled the number of names on the poll list:

That when said canvass was completed a statement of the result was by the inspectors immediately entered on the minutes of the proceedings of these inspectors, and then and there publicly read by one of the inspectors.

That before said polls were opened as aforesaid the undersigned inspectors each duly took and subscribed an oath of office, and the same are hereto attached and made a part of this certificate.

That said election and said canvass of ballots was carefully conducted and in accordance with law, as we verily believe.

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

Petition for Incorporation of Village.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Crow Wing County, Minnesota.

The undersigned petitioners herewith set forth and show to your honorable Board the following facts : -

That they are voters residing within the following described territory in the county of Crow Wing and State of Minnesota, to-wit :
Commencing at the Northeast corner of Section One, Township Forty six North, Range Twenty nine West, and thence running west a distance of two miles to the Northwest corner of Section Two in said township and Range, thence running south a distance of two miles to the Southwest corner of Section Eleven in said Township and Range, thence running East a distance of two miles to the Southeast corner of Section Twelve in said township and range, thence running north a distance of two miles to the place of beginning, excepting therefrom the North half of North east quarter of said section 1, and containing four square miles according to the Government survey, less said N 1/2 of NE 1/4 Sec 1 Twp 46 Rge 29

That said described territory has not been incorporated but that the following part thereof has been platted into lots with a view to village occupancy, to-wit : The South half of the South West quarter of the North West quarter, and Government Lot Number Four, all in section Twelve, Township Forty six, Range Twenty nine, and the unplatted portion of said territory adjoins said platted portion and is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to village government.

That it is proposed to incorporate said territory of four square miles into a village, and the name proposed therefor is "Crosby".

That said territory has a resident population of less than 3000 and more than 200; that your petitioners have caused a census to be taken of the resident population on and between the 4th. day of June 1910 and the 6th. day of June 1910, and the actual resident population of said territory is two hundred and fifty six.

The undersigned voters residing within said territory proposed to be incorporated as the village of Crosby hereby petition your honorable board to call an election for the determination of such proposed incorporation.
