

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We, the undersigned Inspectors duly appointed as such and to be judges of the Election for the determination of the incorporation of certain territory in said Crow Wing County, under the name of "Guyana", duly appointed as such Inspectors, and judges of such election, by resolution of the County Board of said Crow Wing County adopted on the 7th day of June A. D. 1910, do hereby certify:

That at the time and place specified in the notice of such election duly issued by said County Board on the date last above mentioned, to-wit

At Benson's Hall, being a frame Building situate on Lot 17 of
Poly's first addition Block 1 of the platted townsite of Cuyuna, in said County of Crow
Wing, according to the plat of said townsite duly filed and of record
in the Registry of Deeds of said county of Crow Wing, said place being

Petition for incorporation of Village.

To The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Crow Wing in the State of Minnesota.

The undersigned legal voters residing within the territory hereinafter particularly described and which the petitioners desire to have incorporated, do respectfully request the said Board of County Commissioners to call an election, under the laws relating to incorporation of villages, for the determination of this proposed incorporation.

The territory which the petitioners desire to have incorporated as a village, under the name of "Cuyuna", is situated in said County of Crow Wing, and is bounded by lines located and is bounded by lines located and delineated as follows : Commencing at the northeast corner, or one sixteenth corner, of lot five (5) of section twenty-nine (29), township forty-seven (47), range twenty-eight (28), thence going south between lots four (4) and five (5) to the south quarter post of section twenty-nine (29) and continuing on south thru the center of section thirty-two (32) across the range line and down thru the center of section five (5) township forty-six (46) range twenty-eight (28) to the center of section five (5), or what is known as the south east corner of lot five (5) in section five (5) township forty-six (46) range twenty-eight (28); thence west from the center of this section continuing the line thru Agate Lake and continuing west along the center line of section six (6), thence north eighty rods, thence west 160 rods, thence north 80 rods to the north quarter post of section one (1) township forty-six (46) range twenty-nine (29) thence across the township line and continuing the line north thru through the center of section thirty-six (36) to the north quarter post of section thirty-six (36) township forty-seven (47) range twenty-nine (29), thence going east to the north east corner of section thirty-six (36), thence going north on the range line between sections twenty-five and thirty (30) to the meander corner on the south side of Rabbit Lake, thence east from this meander corner following the shore line to the south side of Rabbit Lake to the meander corner, or what is known as the north east corner of lot five (5), section twenty-nine (29) township forty-seven (47) range twenty-eight (28) which is the starting point, which said territory embraces approximately three and one-half ($3\frac{1}{2}$) square miles of land. The number of residents thereon is thirty-six (36).

That between the third and eighth days of February, A. D. 1910, the undersigned petitioners have caused a census to be taken of the resident population within the above described territory, which said census shows such resident population to be more than two hundred and less than three thousand in number.

That a portion of the above described territory has been platted into lots and blocks, and the plats thereof have been duly and legally certified according to the laws of this state and filed in the office of the Register of Deeds for the said County of Crow Wing, and that all unplatte portion of above described territory adjoins the said platted portion thereof and is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to village government.

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE VILLAGE
BOUNDARIES OF THE VILLAGE OF HIBBING
SO AS TO INCLUDE THE WEST HALF ($\frac{W}{2}$)
OF SOUTHWEST QUARTER (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) OF SECTION
32 IN TOWNSHIP FIFTY-EIGHT NORTH, OF RANGE 20
WEST, IN ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

The Village Council of the Village of Hibbing
Do Ordain, as follows:

Section 1. The owners of the West half of the Southwest quarter ($\frac{W}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-two (32) in Township Fifty-eight (58) North, of Range Twenty (20) West, St. Louis County, Minnesota, which land abuts upon the Village of Hibbing, having petitioned the Village Council of the Village of Hibbing to have said land included within said Village, it is ordained that the Village boundaries of the Village of Hibbing be and they are hereby so extended as to include the said land within such boundaries.

Section 2. A copy of this Ordinance shall be forthwith certified by the proper village officers and filed with the Secretary of the State of Minnesota.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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AMENDMENT TO SECTION NINETY FIVE (95) OF THE CHARTER
OF THE CITY OF WILLMAR, MINNESOTA.

- Power to Borrow Money or Incur Debt -

" Sec. 95. The City of Willmar may issue bonds by ordinance as follows:

1. For the purpose of constructing, regulating, maintaining, extending, enlarging or improving suitable water or light plants, or either of them, or for the purpose of acquiring or paying for any real estate or other property needed in connection with any such plant.

2. For the purpose of raising not to exceed fifteen thousand (\$15,000) dollars for a permanent improvement revolving fund provided for in this charter, in order to provide money for any contemplated local improvements, and such bonds shall constitute a first lien upon all such local improvements, and upon the property benefitted thereby and to be assessed therefor.

3. For the purpose of paying, funding or refunding any bonded indebtedness of the City or the interest thereon, existing at the time this Charter goes into effect, or created at any time in any manner by said Charter authorized.

4. For the purpose of constructing main sewers, septic tanks, filtrating plants, and other appurtenances pertaining to a sewer system.

Such ordinance for the issuance of bonds may provide that the same shall be general obligations of the City of Willmar or that they shall not be general obligations, but shall be payable out of any assessed taxes, assessments, funds, or liens held by the City, or may limit the City's liability thereon in any other manner, or shall guarantee that the City shall pay for the same, provided, that the bonds so issued under sub-division two above mentioned shall always be general obligations of the City.

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The City shall have authority to protect itself by acquiring title to any property subject to special assessment for local improvements, and shall have authority by ordinance to assign and convey any property so acquired, whether proceedings to acquire such title have been had prior to the time of the going into effect of this Charter or thereafter, and shall have the power in like manner to assign any lien or right of action, held by the City on account of, or rising out of, any such assessment, as security for the payment of any bonds, certificates of indebtedness or other evidence of indebtedness mentioned in this section, or to provide that such bonds, certificates or other evidence of indebtedness mentioned herein, may be collected out of any such property, liens or rights of action.

Whenever the Council shall pass any ordinance to issue bonds pursuant to the provisions of sub-divisions one, two or four of this section, such ordinance shall provide for the submission to the legal voters of the City, at some general or special election to be called by the Council for that purpose, the proposition for issuing said bonds, to an amount deemed by said Council advisable. Such election, whether general or special shall be conducted in the same manner and with the same formalities as such elections are conducted under the general laws of this state.

The ballot to be voted at such election shall read substantially as follows:- "Shall bonds be issued by the City of Willmar under the provisions of section 95, Chapter V, of the Charter of said City to the amount of _____ dollars, for the purpose of _____

_____, and no such bonds shall be issued until such ordinance has been approved by a majority of the legal voters voting at such election.

The debt of the City shall not be increased by bonds or otherwise beyond eight (8) per-cent of the total value of the taxable property of the City, according to the last preceding assessment for the purpose of taxation; provided, that bonds may be issued as above provided in sub-divisions one, two and four, but the total amount of such bonds when added to the other indebtedness of the City shall not exceed nine (9) per-cent of its taxable property as defined above;

and provided, further, that bonds may be issued, as above provided, for the funding of the City's bonded indebtedness whenever required; and provided, further, that certificates of indebtedness against taxes levied and assessed may be issued as hereinafter provided.

Bonds, certificates and other evidences of indebtedness and obligations of the City authorized by this section shall in no event bear a greater rate of interest than six per-cent per annum, and if they run for more than five years shall not bear a greater rate of interest than five per-cent per annum, and shall in no event be sold for less than the par value thereof, and shall be sold in accordance with the provisions of section 785 of the Revised Laws of the State of Minnesota. Except as provided in this Charter, no warrants, bonds, or other evidence of indebtedness shall be issued by the City or any one in its behalf.
