PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Wednesday, February 2, 1938 has been designated as the Second National Social Hygiene Day by The American Social Hygiene Association and the United States Public Health Service, in order that all citizens may join in a recognition of the importance of the national campaign against syphilis, and

WHEREAS, community knowledge and action are indispensable weapons in this campaign, and

WHEREAS, this timely and appropriate observance unites the forces of health, medical, and civic welfare organizations in a program of education which will help to create wholesome community conditions and curb the ravages of syphilis and gonorrhea,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer A. Benson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim

and I urge all health authorites and voluntary agencies to bring citizens together at that time to consider and adopt practical measures to accomplish these desirable ends.
