Dear Sir:

Please take notice that I, J. W. Wicklund of Walker, Minnesota, intend to apply for the survey of Hand Lake Island in Hand Lake, Section 22-139-29, west of the 5th principal meridian, as public land of the United States. It is my contention that this aforesaid, Hand Lake Island, is public land of the United States and subject to survey and disposition by the U. S. Land Office.

The State of Minnesota owns all other land touching on Hand Lake which falls within the same section as the island is found, the correct description of the adjacent land owned by the State of Minnesota being Lot 4, Section 22-139-29, west of the 5th principal meridian. If the State of Minnesota has any protests against this proposed survey they should be filed with the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Washington, D. C., within 30 days following this service of notice.
