PETITION

To: The Board of County Commissioners of Stearns County, Minnesota:

For the purpose of organizing and incorporating a village in accordance with Section 1111 of Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927 and other laws of the State of Minnesota, pertinent thereto, the undersigned respectfully request and petition that you call an election for the determination of such proposed incorporation, as provided by such laws.

Further, in accordance with said laws, and as a part of this petition, the undersigned do state and make known the following facts, to-wit:

1. The name of the proposed village shall be "Village of Pleasant Lake".

2. That each of the undersigned is an actual resident and legal voter of and in the territory included in the boundaries of the said proposed village.

3. That the territory included in the said proposed village is situated in Stearns County, Minnesota and is all that part of

Gov't. Lots 1 & 2 in Sec. 2, Twp. 123, Rge. 29, less part platted as Lakeside Park; and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 35, Twp. 124, Rge. 29; and all of West 289.05 ft. of Gov't. Lot 1 lying N. of Pleasant Lake; and all of Blocks 11 and 12 in Lakeside Park Addition; and E $\frac{1}{2}$ ly $\frac{1}{2}$ of Oak Street vacated and all of Maple street and Cedar street vacated.

4. That there is embraced within the above described boundaries of said proposed village an acreage of approximately 128.02 acres, plats of which, platting the land included in said respective tracts into lots and blocks, have been duly and legally certified in accordance with the Laws of Minnesota and filed in the office of the said Register of Deeds. That said boundaries also embrace lands so conditioned as properly to be subjected to village government, adjacent to said platted lands, and that none of such territory is included in any incorporated village.

5. That the quantity of land embraced within the boundaries of said proposed village is One hundred twenty eight & 2/100 (128.02) acres.

6. That the number of actual residents on the land included within the boundaries of said proposed village is 104.

A Resolution pertaining to the Incorporation of the Pleasant Lake, was then introduced by Commr. Chas. Weber, who moved its adoption. Commr. Jos M. Weber seconded the motion and upon being put to a vote, it was carried by the affirmative vote of 5 of the commissioners and was then thereupon declared to be adopted. The Resolution is as follows:

Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioner of Stearns County, Minnesota, as follows, to-wit:

That Whereas, a petition has been presented to this Board requesting that in accordance with Section 1111 of Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927 and of the laws of Minnesota pertinent thereto, an election be called to determine whether there be incorporated a village to be known as "Village of Pleasant Lake" and embracing in its territory approximately the following premises (reference is hereby made to said petition for further particularity) to-wit: Gov't Lots 1 & 2 in sec. 2 Twp. 123 Rge. 29 less part platted as Lakeside Park; and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 35, Twp. 124, Rge. 29; and all of West 289.05 ft. of Gov't lot 1 lying N. of Pleasant Lake; and all of Blocks 11 and 12 in Lakeside Park Addition; and E'y $\frac{1}{2}$ of Oak Street vacated and all of Maple Street and Cedar Street vacated.

Whereas, the said petition is signed by 30 duly qualified electors residing within the territory of the said proposed village and is accompanied by a census of the resident population of such territory and in all things complies with the statute in such cases made and provided,

NOW THEREFORE, it is ordered that the said petition be granted and that said election be held at the office of Pleasant Lake Filling Station being in NE. corner of Gov't lot 1, sec. 2-Twp. 123 Rge. 29, on Tuesday the 28th day of June, 1938, from Nine O'clock A.M. until five o'clock P.M. and that the Chairman and County Auditor on behalf of this board, give notice of such election and cause the same to be posted according to law, (there being no newspaper within the territory of said proposed village), and that the Auditor prepare and furnish the necessary ballots and supplies to be used thereat and that he perform all acts and duties required of him by the said laws pertaining to the incorporation of villages.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Joe Liebel, Jos M. Schotl and Mike E. Novitzki, who are duly qualified electors residing with the said territory, are hereby appointed "Inspectors" to conduct the said election and to perform all duties provided by law to be performed by such officers.

CERTIFICATE AND RETURN OF INSPECTORS

We, Joe Liebel, Jos M. Schotl and Mike E.
