Your presentation of the affidavits and petition of Wendell L. Louis
and return to Hahn's Minnesota Affidavits of 1907, election Nov.,

It is ordered:

That you, John Hahn as Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota,
immediately amend and correct your certification to the county auditors of
Anoka and Isanti Counties, respectively, in respect to the nomination of
candidates for the office of Senator in the legislature from the Forty-fourth
District so that the word "(Recent Senator, Isanti)" following the name
of Albert A. Louis will be omitted from such certification.

That you, H. A. Carlson, and R. S. Howell, as County Auditors of
the counties of Anoka and Isanti, respectively, refrain and desist from
preparing, printing, publishing, filling or distributing ballots for use
by the voters of said counties containing the words "(Recent Senator,
Isanti)" following the name of Albert A. Louis.

Or that you and each and all of you show cause before this court
at the State Capitol in St. Paul, Minnesota, on the 10th day of October, 1937,
why you have not done so.

And until further order of the court, you, the said county auditors,
are hereby restrained from taking any steps in preparing, printing, publishing,
filling or distributing ballots containing the words "(Recent Senator, Isanti)"
following the name of Albert A. Louis.

Let copies of this order and the accompanying affidavit and petition
be served forthwith upon the respondent, Wm. Hale by having the same at
his office in the State Capitol Building with the person in charge thereof,
if he is absent therefrom, and upon him personally, if present, and upon
the respondent County Auditor in the same manner as a summons in a civil
action.

COUNTY OF ANOKA

Vernon L. Judd, the petitioner herein, states on oath, that:

1. Your petitioner resides at Rothel, in Anoka County, Minnesota, and is a citizen of the United States and of the State of Minnesota, a voter and taxpayer, and eligible to hold the office of Senator in the State Legislature from the Forty-fourth District of said State.
2. Respondent Miles Holm is Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota and as such one and is charged with the duty of certifying to the auditors of the several counties of the state the names of all persons found by the State Canvassing Board to be nominated as candidates for the Legislature to be voted for in more than one county and including certification of the nominees and candidates for the office of Senator in the Legislature from the Forty-fourth District comprising the counties of Anoka and Isanti.
3. Respondents E. A. Carlson and H. E. Norrell are respectively auditors of Anoka and Isanti Counties, Minnesota, and as such it is the duty of each in his own county to prepare ballots for use of the voters in said county on which shall appear the names of the nominated candidates for the office of Senator in the Legislature from said district.

RE: THE 1928 STATE PRIMARY ELECTION FOR GOVERNOR OF NEW YORK
FOR EACH OFFICE IN WHICH VOTES WERE CAST IN BURLINGTON, ALBANY, AND
SOME TOWNSHIPS, SEE CANDIDATE'S NAME, VOTER'S NAME, AND VOTES RECEIVED AT
THE 1928 PRIMARY ELECTION OUT OF A TOTAL OF 1000 VOTES RECEIVED FOR EACH
OFFICE ON JUNE 20, 1928. FREDERIC M. COOPER, JR., CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR,
RECEIVED 3119 VOTES IN THIS VOTING DISTRICT, ALTHOUGH HE TOOK ONLY 1000 VOTES,
AND YOUR INFORMATION, ALSO VOTES, ARE ACCURATE ~~IN~~ IN THE LISTED DISTRICT
MENTIONED FOR EACH OFFICE.

B. THEREON, ON JULY 23, 1928, THE GOVERNOR, ERIC H. KELLY,
IN PURSUANCE OF THE LAW, COMMISSIONED TO THE RESPONDENT COUNTY
CHIEF OF POLICE OF BURLINGTON FOR EACH OFFICE OF GOVERNOR AND IN
SO DOING COMMISSIONED AS FOLLOWS:

"Pursuant to Sec. 844, Part 11, Article 11-A, Statute Law, 1927, I
hereby certify that the State Convicting Board has duly convened
all the returns of the June 20, 1928 Primary Election which were
made to the Secretary of State and I do hereby further certify
that said Board has duly made the returns which follow to have
been manifested as candidates of the political parties designated
for the offices stated."

THE CANDIDATE IS DESIGNATED FOR BURLENTON AS FOLLOWS:
CANDIDATE L. BROWN
Albert A. Brown (President Senator, Franklin)."

The words in parentheses "President Senator, Franklin" were added
to the name of candidate Brown by respondent Secretary of State at the
request of said Brown no effort was made, all in plain writing
or alike, and ^{said} words were not contained in the papers or findings of the
State Convicting Board.

C. Said proposed order of qualification or disqualification was not
properly a part of the commission by respondent Secretary of State for
the reason that it is the duty of the respondent county auditors to require
the ballots to their respective auditors and the duty of the respondent
Secretary of State merely to certify to said county auditor the return of
the names in without the addition of words of disqualification or otherwise.

7. Opposing candidacy of State has failed to obtain the services of enough local newspapers and prominent county leaders to give the cause of the people that are in their respective counties by the voters thereof. Accordingly, the name of John Johnson and "Albert Johnson (former Senator, Iowa)" is nominated for the office of Governor in the May-September election.

8. Gold County officials endeavor to do their duty as printed on the ballot or certified by the secretary of State and have been specifically instructed by the agent of Johnson to do so. Ballots received by this county, Gold County officials will cause ballots to be printed, published, filed, and distributed according to the name of Alford A. Ladd (present name), Senator.

9. The candidate, Ladd and Johnson, are not of one race and are not pronounced the same. The name Indian is correctly pronounced as though the word spelled "In - di - an" with accent on the first syllable and politician's name is generally pronounced as though it were spelled "I - di - an" with the accent on the last syllable. The distinctability of the Charlston name is apparent and negates any possibility of confusion.

10. Albert A. Ladd is not and for many years has been the son of a farmer by occupation, residing on and operating his own farm in Atlantic County, Iowa County, and his occupation is not that of "present Senator."

11. If the name of Albert A. Ladd as a candidate for the State Senate is placed on the ballot followed by the words above quoted he will receive an unfair and不应该的 advantage over your politician in that it will be unfairly and improperly brought to the attention of each voter as the time he comes that Indian is the present Senator.

12. Gold County officials are required by law to prepare the ballots on which the names of the candidates for the State Senate appear, and to cause one week's published notice of the contents thereof to be given at least five weeks before the election, and to file a copy of such ballots

In said responsive addition to the second Plaintiff's complaint
day, or, 20th October 27, 1930, and to this he has sufficient to make

1. That the respondent, Wm. Helm, Secretary of State, immediately
cancel and correct his corrections in the said paper, edition of the
word "(Protest Senator, Izquierdo)" following the name of Albert A. Leon, and
will be exonerated from such misrepresentation.

2. That the respondents, R. H. Carlson and J. T. Carroll, as county
auditors of the counties of Anoka and Hennepin respectively, refrain and
desist from preparing, printing, publishing, filing or distributing ballots
for use by the voters of said counties containing the word "(Protest
Senator Izquierdo)" following the name of Albert A. Leon.

3. If said said respondents and each and all of them then cause
at a time and place to be fixed by said court they have done so.

4. And also until further order of the court the respondents
county auditors refrain from taking any steps in preparing, printing and
publishing, filing and distributing ballots containing the word "(Protest
Senator, Izquierdo)" thereon following the name of Albert A. Leon.

5. And for each other relief as the petitioner may be entitled to.
