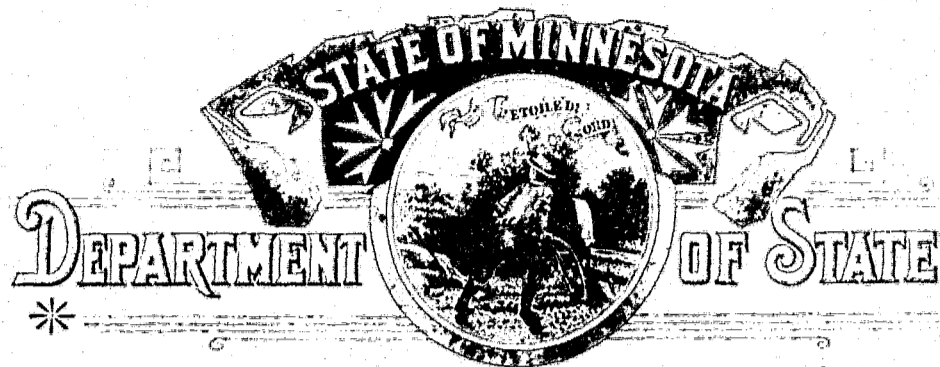

We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Andrew Holt, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Royal A. Stone, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Richard Dillon O'Brien, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Frank E.
