ORDER DESIGNATING MINNESOTA BOARD OF BARBER EXAMINERS AS A FAIR TRADE COMMISSION WITH AUTHORITY TO ASSIST IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 235, LAWS OF 1937, IN ALL MATTERS WHICH AFFECT THE BARBER TRADE IN THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, AND EFFECTIVE AS OF JUNE 3, 1937.

WHEREAS, the undersigned on June 3, 1937 caused to be issued a letter to the State Board of Barber Examiners, in which I authorized, empowered and directed that administrative body to investigate and recommend reasonable rules and regulations to prevent unfair competition and unfair trade practices; and to establish standards of maximum hours of labor, minimum rates of pay, and working conditions in the barbering industry, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 235, Laws of 1937, and in which I also authorized, empowered and directed said body to give notice and conduct hearings on any and all petitions filed by members of the barber trade in accordance with Chapter 235, and report the results of said hearings, together with recommendations, to the undersigned, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said authorization the said Board of Barber Examiners proceeded to investigate conditions in the barber trade pursuant to petitions filed by members of the barber trade, and

WHEREAS, the said Board of Barber Examiners reported the results of said investigations together with recommendations of reasonable rules and regulations to prevent unfair

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competition and unfair trade practices to the undersigned,
and

WHEREAS, the undersigned, as Governor of the State
of Minnesota, declared and prescribed reasonable rules and
regulations to prevent unfair competition and unfair trade
practices in the barber trade for many trade areas within
the State of Minnesota, and


WHEREAS, it appears that no executive order has
ever been filed with the office of the Secretary of State
of the State of Minnesota designating the said Board of
Barber Examiners to so assist in the administration of
the provisions of Chapter 235, Laws of 1937, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable to issue and file
such an order effective as of June 3, 1937, to more
expeditiously administer and enforce the provisions of
Chapter 235, Laws of 1937,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer A. Benson, Governor of
the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in
me by Laws of 1937, Chapter 235, Section 8, do hereby
authorize, empower and direct the Minnesota Board of
Barber Examiners, as of June 3, 1937, to investigate and
recommend reasonable rules and regulations to prevent unfair
competition and unfair trade practices and to establish
standards of maximum hours of labor, minimum rates of pay
and working conditions in the barber trade pursuant to the
provisions of Chapter 235, Laws of 1937, and I further
authorize the Board of Barber Examiners to give notice and
conduct hearings on any petitions filed by members of the
barber trade in accordance with said Chapter 235, and to

report the results of said hearings, together with your recommendations, to the undersigned.
