



BEFORE ALL MEN OF SOUND MINDS, JAMES E. A. BURNQUIST, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Section 114, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1937, do hereby constitute and appoint Carl O. Wegner, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as Special ^{Counsel} ~~Assistant-Attorney-General~~ in the Department of Conservation, and such other work as may be assigned to him; and I hereby fix his compensation in the sum of \$3,000.00 per year, or such additional compensation as may be determined by the Conservation Commissioner, said sums to be paid by the Department of Conservation. Said appointment to commence on January 25th, 1939, and said appointee to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law.


