MINNESOTA STATE BOARD OF NURSING, 07 FEB 1938

The Board approved the course for male students at Saint Mary's School of Nursing, Rochester.	
Forms were prepared and adopted for annual reports to be submitted from all accredited schools of nursing, beginning with reports for the calendar year 1937. Since they have been used for only one year, they do not as yet provide much of a basis for comparison. However, they do reveal some interesting facts. The annual reports showed that 9 of the superintendents of nurses have been appointed within the last year; 4 have held their position for 2 years; and the remainder of the superintendents of nurses have held their positions from 3 years up to 28 years. All of the hospitals conducting schools of nursing but 4 are approved by the American College of Surgeons. All belong to the American Hospital Association.

20 hospitals have an out-patient department in which student nurses receive experience.

27 schools admitted 1 class during the year; 9 schools admitted 2 and 1 school admitted 3 classes.

On January 1, 1938, there were 2,613 students in the schools of nursing, an increase of 5.8% over January 1, 1937.

There has been an increase in students of 23.1% in the last 2½ years.

305 student enrollments were cancelled in 1937; 168 or 55% resigned, and 137 or 45% were dismissed or were asked to resign.

11 schools of nursing gave their applicants mental or aptitude tests to aid in determining their eligibility, and 3 more schools accepted the tests given the students in high school, totaling 51.9%; 13 schools or 42.3% gave no tests.

The 8 schools that offered affiliation had 233 affiliating students.

46 students graduated from post-graduate courses, 33 or about 72% of them graduating from the University.

588 students graduated from schools of nursing during 1937.

In regard to the minimum educational requirements of the schools, all of the 27 schools that admit students for the regular course required graduation from high school; 16 of these requiring that the applicant be in the upper third of her class; 9 in the upper half; 1 school requiring only that the applicant be a high school graduate; 1 school required 3 years of college education.

20 schools required that the applicant be at least 18 years of age;

6 schools required that the applicant be at least 19 years of age; and

1 school required that the applicant be at least 18½ years of age.

18 or 66 2/3% of the schools require that the students pay tuition, and 9 or 28 1/3 do not. The amount of tuition varies from \$10.00 to \$175.00, the tuition being \$100.00 or above in 8 schools. The provision for books and uniforms particularly, is a factor in the amount of tuition required, which, no doubt, accounts, to a large degree, for the variation in the amount of tuition asked.

6 schools give allowances to students, including the schools in the 3 State Hospitals. 1 school gives \$3.00 per month the first year, \$4.00 the second year and \$5.00 the third year; 1 school gives \$6.00, \$7.00 and \$8.00 respectively during the 3 years; 1 gives \$5.00 per month during the entire course. The 3 State Hospitals give larger allowances.

In 24 of the schools the students purchase their own books; in 20 schools the students purchase their own uniforms; and in the remaining 7 the hospitals supply them. This includes 3 hospitals that supply the uniforms after the preliminary period. Thermometers are supplied by all hospitals with schools. All hospitals but one provide hypodermics. In this school the student furnishes her own.

All schools require a complete health examination upon the student's admission, and all but 3 give a health examination before the completion of the first and second years; all but 2 give a health examination before the student completes her third year. All schools but 9 include chest x-rays every year; 6 schools give x-rays if it seems necessary; the remaining ones give x-rays at various periods. Only one

school does not x-ray students.

The requirements regarding immunizations vary considerably. During 1937 students in all schools were ill 14,665 days.

First year students were ill 4,945 days or 33.7% of the total days of illness; Second year students were ill 6,404 days or 36.8% of the total days of illness; Third year students were ill 4,316 days or 29.5% of the total days of illness. A great deal of significance should not be attached to these figures for, in most instances, they do not fairly represent actual illness only; they may represent absence after illness or after an operation. Then too, some schools might give more care in minor ailments of students, than other schools.

10 schools or 37% of all schools give sick leave to students, the amount of time allowed varying from a total of 9 days for the 3 year course to 8 weeks per year.

20 schools or 74% give 63 days vacation during the three year course; 4 schools give 42 days; 1 school 56 days; 1 school 77 days; and 1 school 34 days.

The length of the preliminary period varied.

13 schools have a 4 month preliminary period; 6 schools have a 5 month period; 5 schools have a 6 month period; and 4 schools have a 3 month period.

The number of hours that students spent on the wards per day during the preliminary period varied from 1½ hours to 4 hours, the average being 2.9 hours. The number of hours per week varied from 10 to 28 hours, the average being 17½ hours. After the preliminary period, the number of hours the students spent on duty, exclusive of time spent at meals, study or class, showed an average of 7 1/3 hours per day and 8 1/3 hours per night. The number of hours students worked per week on day duty varied from 36 to 54 hours, with an average of 47 hours; night duty varied from 45 to 69 hours per week, with an average of 53 hours.

In regard to the hours of theory given during the student's entire course, the annual reports showed that the lowest number of hours of theory given was 671, the highest 1636 hours, and the average 939 hours. It was found that 40% of the theory was given during the preliminary period, 21% was given during the remainder of the first year, or a total of 61% during the first year; 23% was given during the second year and 17% was given during the third year.

In 14 schools, or 51.8% of them, the students received no experience in psychiatric nursing. This condition is being greatly improved, inasmuch as, on July 1, 1937, the State Hospital, Saint Peter, offered an affiliation in this service to students of other schools.

19 schools or 70.4% received no experience in tuberculosis nursing;
10 schools or 37% received no experience in communicable disease nursing;
23 schools or 85.2% received no experience in public health nursing.

4 of the schools did not have a full-time science instructor and a full-time nursing arts instructor, these instructors having to assume additional responsibilities.

570 registered nurses were employed as supervisors and head nurses in the hospitals with schools. 1023 registered nurses were regularly employed on general duty in these hospitals. The total number of all graduate registered nurses, except special nurses, who were regularly employed in the hospitals with schools, was 1,534.

551 or 38% were eligible for membership in the Minnesota League of Nursing Education, but only 236 or 40.8% of those eligible were League members. 281 nurses' aids were employed in the hospitals with schools, the largest number in any one hospital being 25, the lowest number 1.

Only 3 schools of nursing had a budget separate from that of the hospital.

23 of the 31 schools have school of nursing committees or councils, and the average number of meetings held during the year was 6. 5 committees met when it was deemed necessary.

2 of the schools did not own a copy of the Curriculum Guide, the remaining 29 possessing from 1 to 6 copies.

3 schools of nursing offer Degree Courses, namely the University School of Nursing, Saint Mary's School of Nursing, Rochester, and Saint Mary's School of Nursing, Duluth.

Miss Muriel Thomas was appointed by the Board to the position of Educational Director of Nursing Education in Minnesota September 15, 1937. Her activities and accomplishments during the past 9½ months are indicative of the importance of her work, which has centered chiefly about surveys of schools of nursing and hospitals, participation in the revision and preparation of "Minimum Standards and Recommendations for Minnesota Schools of Nursing," participation in the work of the League and various committees relating to nursing education, revision of

the survey found, preparation of supplementary course material for the schools, and conferences in advisory capacity, with school of nursing and hospital administrators. (Miss Thoms will submit a detailed report to the Board.)

Miss Rebecca Peterson's resignation from the Board was accepted by Governor Bonson August 3, 1937. Miss Esther Wolfe was appointed by Governor Boneon on January 31, 1938, to fill the unexpired term of Miss Peterson, namely till May 1, 1940.

The "Special Committee to Confer with the Board" had 3 meetings with the Board. A fourth meeting planned was cancelled. It is the Board's aim to inform the groups represented on the committee of its activities and functions and of its relationship to the various nursing organizations, and to promote a fitting relationship between all of these groups, which is essential to meet the health service needs of the community.

The Board recommended to the Minnesota schools of nursing the new nursing school records and the guide for their use, prepared by the National League of Nursing Education.

The pamphlet "Nursing and How to Prepare for It," together with other informational material, was sent to all prospective students for schools of nursing.

The 3 State Hospital Schools of Nursing have had to make considerable change in their arrangements for the affiliation of their students at other hospitals, because of the inability of the Andover Hospital to house these students, due to a lack of rooms available to student nurses. Arrangements are not as yet completed.

The chief project of the Board during the past year has been the revision of its former requirements and the preparation of a bulletin "Minimum Standards and Recommendations for Minnesota Schools of Nursing," which work was begun previous to this fiscal year, and has continued during this year. In connection with this, the Board has given a great deal of time to the study of curriculum construction, aims and objectives in general education and nursing as well, to the schedules of criteria and the program of the National League of Nursing Education Committee on Accrediting on a national basis, to the publications of the League relative thereto, and to the standards and requirements of the various states. The Curriculum Guide of the National League of Nursing Education was used as a basis. The work of the Board finally evolved into the formulation of a mimeographed bulletin incorporating the minimum standards and recommendations for schools of nursing, to be used as a tentative outline and basis for study and discussion, suggestions and criticisms at a conference of the Board with interested groups.

The conference was held on June 1 and 2, 1938, in the Auditorium of the State Office Building. Invitations to the conference were sent to directors of schools of nursing, school of nursing faculties, hospital administrators, boards of trustees, school of nursing committees, staffs of hospitals, the official registries, state nursing organizations and the "Special Committee to Confer with the Board." In advance of the conference, copies of the bulletin were distributed to these groups for study. Statistical material was prepared in relation to theory and nursing practice as follows:

- (c) Minimum requirements of 1937 Minnesota Curriculum in all subjects.
- (d) The highest, lowest and median number of hours of theory per subject actually given in Minnesota in 1937.
- (e) Minimum requirements of 1937 Minnesota Curriculum in clinical service.
- (f) The highest, lowest and median number of days spent by students in all clinical services.
- (g) Proposed minimum requirements in Minnesota in relation to theory and nursing practice.
- (h) Recommendations of Curriculum Guide in relation to same.
- (i) Requirements of some of other states.

The Secretary of the Board was Chairman of Arrangements, covering invitations, announcements, publicity, programs, speakers, stenotypist and dinner meeting. There was marked participation on the part of those attending, in terms of discussion, suggestions and recommendations. The total registration was 170, with representation from all groups invited. All of the 31 accredited schools of nursing sent representation, the largest number from any one school being 19, the smallest one. 3 hospitals in North Dakota sent a total of 5 persons. A nurse from Brazil attended the entire conference.

A dinner meeting was held on the evening of the first day of the conference, at which time Mr. Roy C. Frank, Assistant Attorney General, represented the state in an address of welcome to the group. The speakers were Miss Muriel Thomas, Educational Director; and Judge Vernon Gates of Rochester.

In relation to the requirements for nurse registration, it was the opinion of the conference that there needs to be serious consideration and study given by the Minnesota Nurses' Association to annual registration; to the licensing of all who nurse; and to nursing in isolated communities; that the Legislative Committee of the Minnesota Nurses' Association work with related agencies in the state, and with the State Medical Association and the Minnesota Hospital Association.

In the opinion of the Board and of those who attended, the entire conference was most gratifying and successful. It would appear that light on common problems is to be found in cooperative effort and in sharing the results of individual effort and experience.

The adoption of the "Minimum Standards and Recommendations for Minnesota Schools of Nursing" will be considered in the near future.

The Educational Director and the Secretary represented the Board, with the Governor's approval, at the Biennial Convention of the three national nursing organizations at Kansas City, Missouri, in April 1938. The convention was followed by a one day conference of State Boards of Examiners of Nurses, at which conference the Secretary presided at a half day session, dealing with legislation.

With the Board's approval, and with no expense to the Board, the Secretary participated in a series of institutes sponsored by the Minnesota Nurses' Association, and given in eight Minnesota cities in May 1938. 344 nurses attended.

The Secretary spoke on the history, provisions and implications of the Minnesota law relating to registration of nurses, and on nursing legislation in general.

Secretary gave talks to student nurses during the year on "Legislation and Registration, on the Federal Nursing Services and on the American Red Cross Nursing Service."

No examination has been made during the fiscal year of the books, records and affairs of the Board by the Public Accounting Division, Department of Administration and Finance; hence there is no report on same.

The Attorney General continues to generously serve the Board with legal assistance.

The publishers of nurse text books have made valuable and much appreciated contributions of recent publications to the Board library.

New office equipment includes a magazine cabinet, made by W.P.A. workers, three steel files, one chair.

Because of the pressure of office work, an additional stenographer was employed on a temporary basis for 27½ days.

The present clerical office personnel includes: Miss Helen Devine, Senior Clerk and Bookkeeper, and Miss Alice Dremal, Senior Stenographer.
