appointed by the secretary of state of the State of Minnesota, pur-  
suant to the provisions of Chapter 417, Laws of 1921 as supervisor

That, thereafter, this deponent and said enumerators agreed in  
writing and under oath to perform their duties in connection with said

secretary of state, as more fully appears from Exhibits \_\_\_\_\_

That between the dates of February 18-1939 and February  
25<sup>th</sup>, 1939, all of the inhabitants of said Village of Mountain Iron  
were personally interviewed by one of the above enumerators

above mentioned, working under deponent's supervision; that a separate card was prepared for each of the residents of said district, containing the names of such resident, and also containing other data, required by the secretary of state; that these cards were prepared by said enumerators under the direction of this deponent and said cards have been duly filed with said Secretary of State; that the facts stated on said cards are true and reference is hereby made thereto for that purpose.

That, as a result of said census, it appears that there were on February 24<sup>th</sup>, 1939, Fifteen hundred eighty-seven residents ( 1587 ) of said Village of Mountain Iron.

That, after the enumeration of the inhabitants of said Village of Mountain Iron each of the above mentioned enumerators and this deponent executed an affidavit to the effect that the facts stated in said cards were true. Said affidavits were hereto attached and made a part hereof and marked Exhibits.

Further, affiant sayeth not, save that this affidavit is made for the secretary of state of Minnesota to be filed in his office as a report of the results of the census ~~of the census~~ of the inhabitants of said Village of Mountain Iron; made by this deponent under his direction.
