ORDER

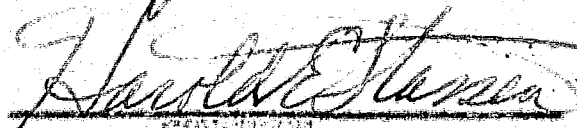
The above entitled matter came duly on for hearing on March 28, 1937, before me, Harold L. Stassen, Governor of Minnesota, upon complaints of malfeasance in office made to me against Robert J. Seiberlich, member of the State Athletic Commission, after due notice to him. Robert J. Seiberlich appeared in person and by his attorney, Louis Solen of Minneapolis. Hughes, Morgan and Fisch, attorneys, of Minneapolis appeared for certain complainants and Donald C. Rogers, the commissioner, and Hayes Dunsingburg, Assistant Attorney General, appeared at my request.

Upon the evidence taken before Donald C. Rogers, who was duly appointed by me as special commissioner for such purpose, whose evidence was duly recorded and submitted to me, and upon the arguments of counsel together with the brief submitted by Mr. Louis Solen, I find that Robert J. Seiberlich is guilty of malfeasance in office in that he improperly used his official position as a member of the State Athletic Commission to further his private business interests.

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WHEREFORE, I, Harold L. Stassen, Governor of
Minnesota, do hereby remove Robert J. Selberlie as a
member of the State Athletic Commission.
