ORDER

The Petition of the City National Bank of Duluth, Minnesota,  
and R. B. Power, as administrators do beseech now with will annexed of the  
Estate of Victor L. Power, also known as Victor L. Power, decedent, having  
been filed in the above named Court, and showing among other things:

1. That said Petitioners are the duly appointed, qualified, and  
acting administrators of the Estate of Victor L. Power, also known as  
Victor L. Power, decedent, having been duly appointed such by the Probate  
Court of St. Louis County, Minnesota.

2. That said Petitioners have in their possession the sum of  
One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) as such representatives of said estate,  
which they hold for distribution to Walter J. Power under a partial decree  
of the Probate Court of St. Louis County, Minnesota.

3. That said money is claimed adversely by two or more other  
persons on account of the following fact, to-wit:

That the said Walter J. Power did, prior to the making of the  
Petition herein, execute and deliver certain assignments of monies due him  
from said administrators to the certain persons whose addresses are listed  
and in the various amounts and on the various dates as appear in Exhibit "A"  
attached hereto and made a part of this Order, and that there are certain  
judgments of record against said Walter J. Power as indicated by Exhibit "B"  
attached hereto and made a part of this Order, showing the name and address  
of the judgment creditor, the amount of said judgment and the date of said  
judgment, and the date of docketing thereof.

4. That each of said persons named in Exhibits "A" and "B" claims  
that he is entitled to said monies for the purpose of paying the obligation  
due him as described in Exhibits "A" and "B".

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6. That the right to said monies as between said parties is in doubt and that said petitioners are in doubt and do not know to whom to pay said monies.

6. That the names and places of residence of all known claimants of said monies to be set forth in Exhibits "A" and "B".

7. That said petitioners as said representatives of said estate of Victor L. Power, decedent, claim no interest in and to said monies.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: That the Clerk of District Court, Fred Ash, Duluth, Minnesota, be designated as depository to whom said monies shall be paid by the City National Bank of Duluth and R. B. Power, as administrators de bonis non with will annexed of the estate of Victor Leo Power, also known as Victor L. Power, decedent, petitioners.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon said delivery and payment of said money to said Clerk of District Court, Fred Ash, Duluth, Minnesota, that the said The City National Bank of Duluth, Minnesota, and R. B. Power, as said administrators of said estate of Victor L. Power, give notice thereof to all interested persons by serving a copy of this Order by Registered mail upon the assignees and judgment creditors, or their respective attorneys, named in Exhibits "A" and "B" hereto attached.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon such delivery and payment of said monies to said Clerk of District Court, Fred Ash, Duluth, Minnesota, and upon giving notice heretofore provided for, that The City National Bank of Duluth, Minnesota, and R. B. Power, as administrators de bonis non with will annexed of the estate of Victor Leo Power, also known as Victor L. Power, decedent, be relieved from further liability on account thereof.
