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Petition to the County Board of the County of Anoka in the State of Minnesota to call an election for the determination of the proposed incorporation of the Village of Centerville.

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Anoka in the State of Minnesota:-

Petitioners - We undersigned do respectfully represent and show to your Honorable Board:-

First - That they and each of them are legal voters residing within the territory hereinbefore described, proposed to be incorporated as the Village of Centerville.

Second - That they have on this first day of August, A.D. 1910, caused to be taken an accurate census of the resident population of the territory to be incorporated, and that there are according to said census, and on said day, two hundred and ~~sixty seven~~ (27) persons actually residents upon the territory, proposed to be incorporated, and that the actual resident population of said territory and on said day is two hundred and ^{Twenty seven} ~~sixty seven~~ (27).

Third - That no part of said territory proposed to be incorporated is within any incorporated village.

Fourth - That all of said territory is within the State of Minnesota, and a portion thereof has been platted into lots and blocks, by plan duly and legally certified according to the law of this state, and filed in the office of the Register of Deeds for the County of Anoka, wherein all of said lots are situated and lie, and the unplat portion of said territory proposed to be incorporated abutting the platted portions thereof, and all of said territory proposed to be incorporated is so constituted as properly to be subjected to village government.

Fifth - That the name of the village proposed to be incorporated is the Village of Centerville.

Sixth - That the boundaries of the territory proposed to be incorporated are as follows, to-wit - Commencing at the quarter corner post on the east side of section fourteen (14), thence south one half mile to the southwest corner of said section fourteen; thence east one quarter mile to the one sixteenth corner post on the north side of the northwest quarter of section twenty four; thence south one mile to the one sixteenth corner post on the south side of the northeast quarter of section twenty four;
