

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF

REGISTRATION

AND VOTERS OF

PELLICAN LAKE

We, the undersigned legal voters residing within the territory hereinafter described, do hereby respectfully petition the County Board of the County of Gray Wing, Minnesota, to call an election for the purpose of determining the proposed incorporation of the Village of Pelican Lake pursuant to the provision of Chapter 9, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927.

The territory proposed to be incorporated consists of Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 16, 18, 17, 19, the north half of 19, 20 and 21, all in the Township of Pelican, County of Gray Wing, Minnesota. Said territory consists of certain property which has been platted into blocks and lots and for which plats have been duly and legally certified according to the laws of Minnesota and filed in the office of the Register of Deeds of said county, and are designated as follows, to-wit: "Garrett's First Subdivision of Green Point" and "Highwater Beach" and it includes unplatted territory adjacent thereto, all as set forth in more detail in Exhibit "A" hereto attached and made a part hereof. Said territory contains a resident population of more than one hundred and less than three thousand people, to-wit: one hundred thirty-four (134). The quantity of land embraced in the proposed village and shown on a plat thereof, which is submitted together with this petition, amounts to approximately eight thousand five hundred and seventy-six (8,576) acres.

That the proposed name of the village shall be Pelican Lake.

Dated June 2nd, 1933, and respectfully submitted to the Board of County Commissioners for its approval and for such other action as is required by law.

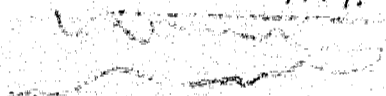
