The voters present at nine o'clock A.M. chose viva voce
Joseph Mysich, one of the judges of said election,
to act as Moderator of the meeting.

The voters present at nine o'clock A.M. chose viva voce
Steve Starcevic, to act as Clerk of the election.

The judges of election had previously taken and subscribed
the oath required of judges of elections.

The judges of election then appointed Steve Starcevic
to act as Clerk of said election.

The said Clerk then took and subscribed the oath required
of Clerks of Election.

The Moderator then proclaimed that the polls were open.

All the judges and clerk of election were present at the
polling place from nine o'clock A.M. to five o'clock P.M. and
acted as judges and clerk respectively in the conduct of the
election.

The Clerk kept a poll list upon which he entered the
names of each person whose vote was received; each ballot received
was handed to one of the judges and by him deposited in the ballot
box; each ballot was so folded as to conceal its contents.

At four-thirty o'clock P.M. the Moderator proclaimed that
the polls would be closed in thirty minutes.

At five o'clock P.M. the Moderator proclaimed that the
polls were closed.

At five o'clock P.M. the judges of election began publicly
to canvass the votes cast at said election and said canvass was
continued without adjournment or interruption until completed.

The canvass of votes showed that there were cast at said election 123 votes; that 99 votes were cast for the proposition to incorporate said Village of Leontonia; and 24 votes were cast against said proposition.

Thereupon the Clerk entered at length the result of said election and of said canvass and the minutes of the proceedings of said election and publicly read to the meeting the result of said election and canvass as so recorded.

Thereupon the Judges of Election made, subscribed and verified a certificate stating the time and place of holding said election, that they had canvassed the ballots cast thereat, and the number cast both for and against said proposition.

WHEREAS, said verified petition sets out that the population in such area petitioned to be so incorporated into a village is more than 100 and less than 3,000.

WHEREAS, A petition has been presented to this body signed by more than twenty-five electors residing in the territory therein described, as shown by the verification of three persons thereto attached and duly subscribed and sworn to before a notary public, petitioning for the incorporation of a village to be known as Leestonia within the Town of Stuntz, this county, and

WHEREAS, Said verified petition sets out that the population in such area petitioned to be so incorporated into a village is more than 100 and less than 3,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of St. Louis County, Minnesota, that said petition be and hereby is approved and that an election shall be held on the 5th day of December, 1939, between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on said date, in the grocery store building of John Delancey, Leestonia Townsite, within said territory, for the purpose of enabling the voters and electors within said territory or district to vote upon the question as to whether or not such territory shall be incorporated as a village.
