It is agreed that the contractor will enter upon the  
performance of the contract promptly, and in accordance with

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The following article is, heretofore and hereinafter referred to as Article 11.

Article 11. Payment of Contract Price and Allowances  
and the contractor shall receive payment in full for all work  
done, and the price stipulated in the contract and the amount  
of such difference shall be paid by the contractor to the state  
as account.

Payment will be made in the usual course of  
state payment and at the times and subject to the conditions  
stated in the specifications and subject to the terms and con-  
ditions of this agreement.

The contractor herewith shall give bond to the  
state with corporate surety acceptable to the commission in the  
full amount of the contract price conditioned in accordance with  
the requirements of Section 8700, General Statutes 1903 relating  
to contractors' bonds.

The surety shall not be entitled to notice of  
authorized changes made in the specifications.

This memorandum of agreement shall become bind-  
ing upon the parties when signed in behalf of the state by the  
commission over the signature of its chairman and when signed  
in person by the contractor.
