WRIT OF ELECTION TO FILL VACANCY IN THE
OFFICE OF STATE SENATOR FROM THE SIXTIETH
SENATORIAL DISTRICT OF THE STATE

To the people of the State of Minnesota, particularly
of the Sixtieth Senatorial District; to the Secretary
of State; to the County Auditor of the County of St.
Louis; to all election officials, and to all others
whom it may concern - GREETING:

WHEREAS, a vacancy now exists in the office of state
senator from the sixtieth senatorial district caused by the death
of the late state senator, the Honorable Richard Kelly of Chisholm,
and

WHEREAS, the state legislature is not now in session,
and there will not be any other occasion for the exercise of the
functions of said office before the time fixed by law for the
final canvass of the general election returns at the next general
election,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold E. Stassen, as Governor of
the State of Minnesota, acting under the authority and direction
of Section 17 of Article 4 of the constitution, and the laws of
this state, do direct that said vacancy be filled at the November
5, 1940 general election, and also that nominations therefor be
made at the September 10, 1940 regular primary election.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto caused the great
seal of the state to be affixed, and have hereunto set my hand
at the Capitol in the City of St. Paul, Minnesota, this 12th day
of June, 1940.
