AND POLITICAL, AND THAT THE STATE COMMITTEE HAS APPOINTED THEM
AS SUPERVISORS;

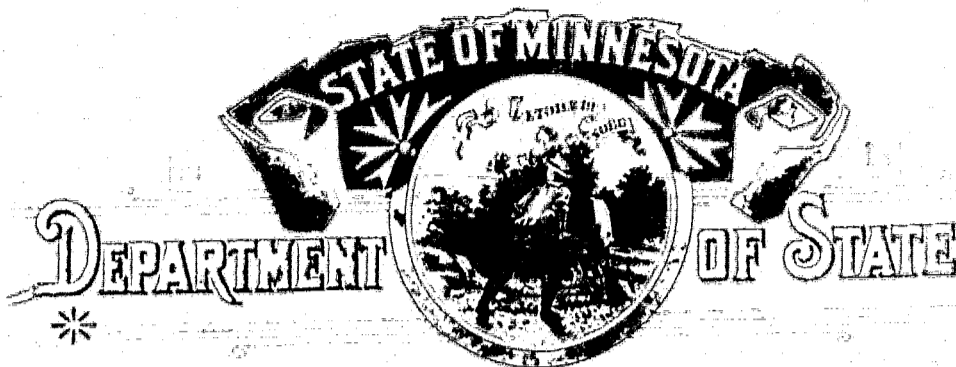

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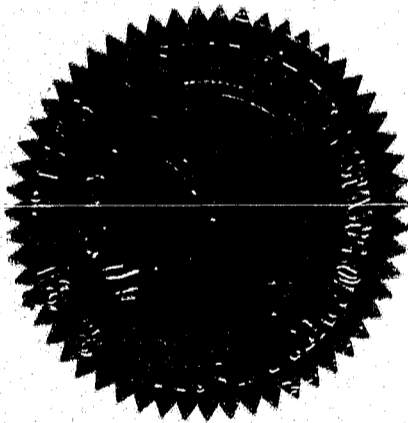



TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

Be it known that on the eleventh day of March, 1940, a petition for the organization of the Upper Zumbro Soil Conservation District, signed by more than 25 land occupiers, was duly filed in the Office of the State Soil Conservation Committee;

That on the twenty-fifth day of March, 1940, at Rochester; on the twenty-fifth day of March at Uronoco; on the twenty-sixth day of March, 1940 at Mantorville; on the twenty-sixth day of March at Byron; on the tenth day of April, 1940 at Byron, public hearing was held after due notice of the said hearing had been given as required by law;

That on the first day of May, 1940, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that there is need in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, for a soil conservation district to function in the proposed territory and did define the boundaries thereof;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee on the question of the creation of the said district;

That the said referendum was held within the said defined boundaries on the twenty-sixth day of August, 1940;

That the result of the said referendum showed that a majority of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the creation of the said district;

That thereafter on the fourth day of September, 1940, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that the operation of the said district is administratively practicable and feasible;

That the boundaries of the said district were defined by the State Soil Conservation Committee as follows:

Including the Townships of Haverhill, Rochester, Marion, Kalmer, New Haven, Salem, Cronoco and Cascade in the County of Olmsted, State of Minnesota; and the Townships of Milton, Mantorville and Carlsted in the County of Dodge, State of Minnesota.

There shall be exempted from the lands bounded by the above description sections 3, 11 and 12 in the Township of Rochester, County of Olmsted, State of Minnesota; Garden Acres and Knollwood Acres being located in the NE¹/₄ of Section 14, Township of Rochester, County of Olmsted, State of Minnesota; Sections 25, 26 and 34 in the Township of Cascade, County of Olmsted, State of Minnesota; all parts or parcels of lands used for religious, burial or school purposes; and all tracts of land in cities, villages or towns which lands are used exclusively for habitation or business purposes other than farming.





TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

Be it known that on the 1 day of May, 1944, a petition for the inclusion of additional territory within the Upper Zumbro Soil Conservation District, signed by more than 25 land occupiers was duly filed in the office of the State Soil Conservation Committee:

That on the 1 day of June, 1944, at Stewartville; on the 2 day of June, 1944, at Eyota, and on the 3 day of June, 1944, at Chatfield, public hearing was held after due notice of the said hearing had been given as required by law;

That on the 9 day of August, 1944, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that there is need in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, for including the additional territory within the Upper Zumbro Soil Conservation District and did define the boundaries of such additional territory;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee on the questions of inclusion of said territory within the said district;

That the said referendum was held within the said defined boundaries on the 7 day of September, 1944;

That the result of the said referendum showed that a majority of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the inclusion of said additional territory within the said district;


That thereafter on the 20 day of October, 1944, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that inclusion of said additional territory within the said district is administratively practicable and feasible;

That the boundaries of the said additional territory were defined by the State Soil Conservation Committee as follows:

Including the townships of Farmington, Viola, Quincy, Eyota, Dover, Rock Dell, High Forest, Pleasant Grove, Orion, and Elmira, all in Olmsted County, Minnesota.

There shall be exempted from the lands bounded by the above description all parts or parcels of lands used for religious, burial or school purposes; and all tracts of land in cities, villages or towns which lands are used exclusively for habitation or business purposes other than farming.
