To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greetings:

Whereas, a certificate of due organization of the Dakhue Soil Conservation District as a governmental subdivision of this state and a public body corporate and politic was issued by this office on the 6th day of November, 1940; and

Whereas, the district governing body, on the 29th day of March, 1955, approved the detachment of all that portion of the Dakhue Soil Conservation District lying within Dakota County and annexation of same to the Dakota County Soil Conservation District; and

Whereas, the Dakota County Soil Conservation District governing body, on the 30th day of March, 1955, by resolution approved such annexation; and

Whereas, the STATE SOIL CONSERVATION COMMITTEE, on the 13th day of April, 1955, pursuant to power and authority vested in this committee by law, by resolution detached the above described area from the Dakhue Soil Conservation District and annexed same to the Dakota County Soil Conservation District; and

Whereas, copies of said resolutions and statement have been made and filed in this office as required by law.

Now, Therefore, it is hereby certified that the territory described in said statement has been duly separated from the Dakhue Soil Conservation District.

That pursuant to the provisions of the Soil Conservation Districts Law, Chapter 441, Minnesota Session Laws, 1937, a petition for the creation of the Dankhue Soil Conservation District was filed with the State Soil Conservation Committee; that the proceedings specified in the said act were taken pursuant to the said petition as more fully appears in the statement by the State Soil Conservation Committee hereto attached and made a part of this application; that this application is being filed in order to complete the organization of the said district as a governmental subdivision and a public body, corporate and politic, as provided by the said act; and that the State Soil Conservation Committee has appointed the undersigned as supervisors of the said Soil Conservation District.



That on the 1st day of May, 1940, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that there is need in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, for a soil conservation district to function in the proposed territory and did define the boundaries thereof;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee on the question of the creation of the said district;

That the said referendum was held within the said defined boundaries on the 21st day of September, 1940;

That the result of the said referendum showed that a majority of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the creation of the said district;

That thereafter on the 2nd day of November, 1940, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that the operation of the said district is administratively practicable and feasible;

That the boundaries of the said district were defined by the State Soil Conservation Committee as follows:

Including the Townships of Douglas, Ravenna and Marshan and the City of Hastings in the County of Dakota, State of Minnesota; and the Townships of Stanton, Warsaw, Welch, Cannon Falls, Leon, Vasa and Belle Creek in the County of Goodhue, State of Minnesota.

There shall be exempted from the lands bounded by the above description all parts or parcels of lands used for burial, religious or school purposes; all tracts of lands in cities, villages or towns which lands are used exclusively for habitation or business purposes other than farming; and in rural or urban areas any tracts of three acres or less which are used principally for habitation or business purposes other than farming.

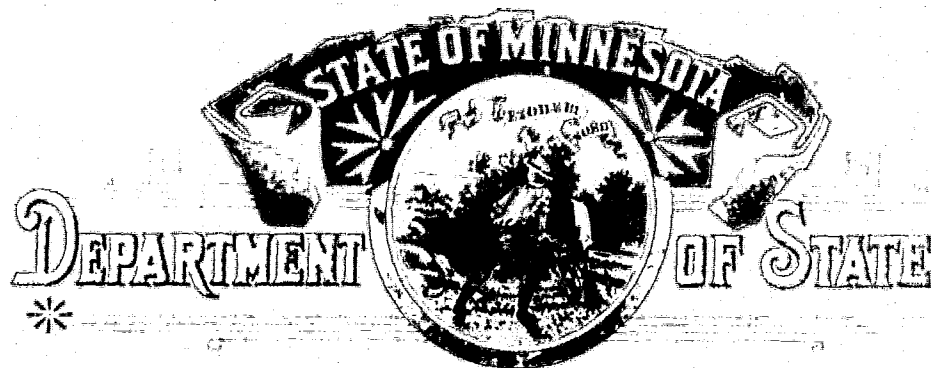

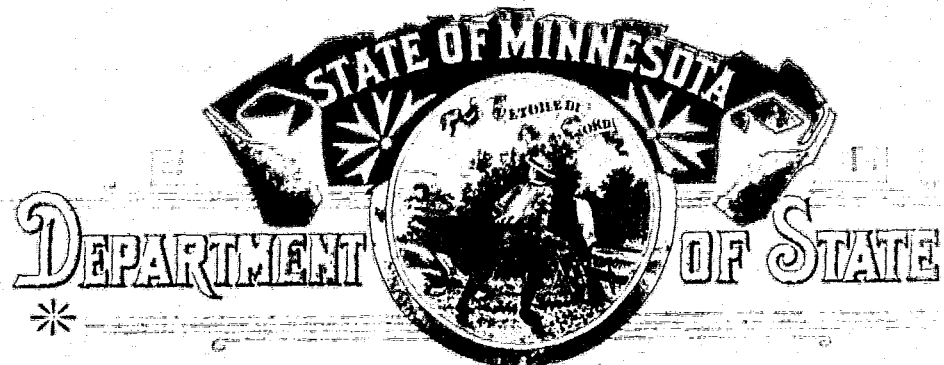
CERTIFICATE OF DUE ORGANIZATION OF THE DAKHUE SOIL CON-

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, ARTHUR NELSON AND JOSEPH ROSTAD, RESIDING AT
CANNON FALLS AND GOODHUE, MINNESOTA, RESPECTIVELY, THE DULY
APPOINTED SUPERVISORS OF THE DAKHUE SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT,
ACTING PURSUANT TO THE MINNESOTA SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICTS
LAW, CHAPTER 44I OF THE LAWS OF MINNESOTA FOR 1937, APPROVED
APRIL 26, 1937, HAVE FILED IN THIS OFFICE AN APPLICATION,
SUBSCRIBED AND SWORN TO BY EACH OF THEM BEFORE AN OFFICER
AUTHORIZED BY LAW TO TAKE AND CERTIFY OATHS, SETTING FORTH:

(1) THAT A PETITION FOR THE CREATION OF THE DISTRICT WAS
FILED WITH THE STATE SOIL CONSERVATION COMMITTEE, PURSUANT
TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICTS
LAW, AND THE PROCEEDINGS SPECIFIED IN SAID ACT WERE TAKEN
PURSUANT TO SUCH PETITION, THAT THE SAID APPLICATION WAS
FILED IN ORDER TO COMPLETE THE ORGANIZATION OF THE DISTRICT
AS A GOVERNMENTAL SUBDIVISION AND A PUBLIC BODY, CORPORATE
AND POLITIC, AND THAT THE STATE COMMITTEE HAS APPOINTED
THEM AS SUPERVISORS; (2) THE NAME AND OFFICIAL RESIDENCE OF
THE DISTRICT SUPERVISORS, TOGETHER WITH A CERTIFIED COPY OF
THE APPOINTMENTS EVIDENCING THEIR RIGHT TO OFFICE; (3) THEIR

WHEREAS, A STATEMENT BY THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMITTEE, ACCOMPANYING THE ABOVE-MENTIONED APPLICATION HAS BEEN FILED IN THIS OFFICE, SETTING FORTH THAT A PETITION FOR THE CREATION OF THE DAKHUE SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT WAS FILED WITH THE STATE SOIL CONSERVATION COMMITTEE; THAT, AFTER DUE NOTICE, A HEARING WAS HELD, AND THE COMMITTEE DULY DETERMINED THAT THERE IS NEED, IN THE INTEREST OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE, FOR A SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO FUNCTION IN THE PROPOSED TERRITORY, AND THAT THE COMMITTEE DEFINED THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; THAT THEN, AFTER DUE NOTICE, A REFERENDUM WAS HELD ON THE QUESTION OF THE CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT, AND THE RESULTS OF SAID REFERENDUM SHOWED A MAJORITY OF THE VOTES CAST TO BE IN FAVOR OF THE CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT; AND THAT THEREAFTER THE COMMITTEE DID DULY DETERMINE THAT THE OPERATION OF THE PROPOSED DISTRICT IS ADMINISTRATIVELY PRACTICABLE AND FEASIBLE. SAID STATEMENT ALSO SET FORTH THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT AS DEFINED BY THE STATE COMMITTEE.

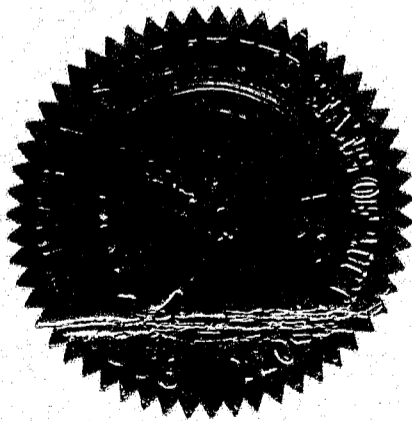
