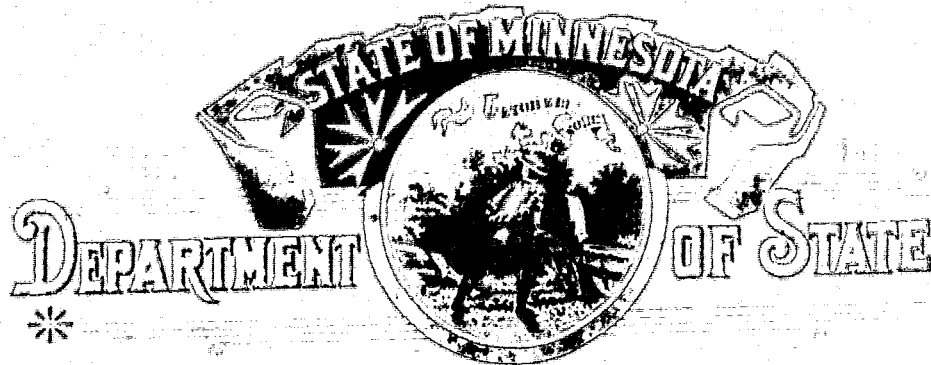

THE NUMBER NECESSARY FOR THE RATIFICATION OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT WAS SIX HUNDRED SEVENTY THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-SEVEN (680,787).

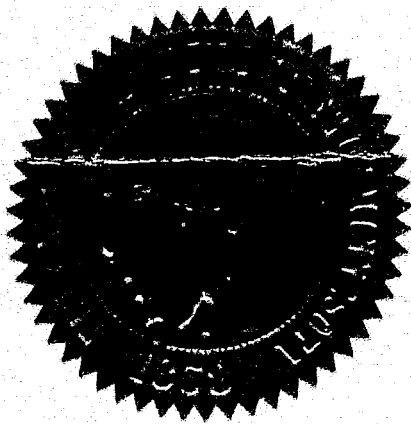

WE, MIKE HOLM, SECRETARY OF STATE, Andrew Holt, ASSOCIATE JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT, Charles Loring, ASSOCIATE JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT, Hugo C. Vanft, JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT, SECOND JUDICIAL DISTRICT, AND Lars O.
