


KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Section 114, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, and the written request of the Railroad and Warehouse Commission, do hereby constitute and appoint George T. Simpson of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as SPECIAL COUNSEL for the Railroad and Warehouse Commission, for the period commencing January 16, 1941, and to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law; and I hereby fix the compensation of said George T. Simpson as such Special Counsel for the Railroad and Warehouse Commission, at the sum of Five Hundred and No/100 Dollars per month to be paid from the appropriations made for the Railroad and Warehouse Commission.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this 15th day of January, 1941.


