


KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Section 114, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, do hereby constitute and appoint Carl O. Wegner of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as SPECIAL ATTORNEY for the Department of Conservation, on its written request for such appointment on the basis of his giving at least fifty per cent of his time on behalf of said department; and I hereby fix his compensation in the sum of Fifteen Hundred and No/100 Dollars per year, said sum to be paid by the Department of Conservation. Said appointment to commence on January 6, 1941, and said appointee to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law.


