Statement by the State
Soil Conservation

#### TO ALL TO WHOM THESE FRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

Be it known that on the first day of February, 1941, a petition for the organization of the Lake Pepin Soil Conservation District, signed by more than 25 land occupiers was duly filed in the Office of the State Soil Conservation Committee:

That on the twenty-sixth day of February, 1941, at Mazeppa; on the twenty-sixth day of February, 1941, at Oak Center; on the twenty-seventh day of February, 1941, at Wabasha; and on the twenty-eighth day of February, 1941, at Millville, public hearing was held after due notice of the said hearing had been given as required by law;

That on the eleventh day of Narch, 1941, the State Soil Conservation Committee Gid duly determine that there is need in theinterest of the public health, safety and welfare, for a soil conservation district to function in the proposed territory and did define the boundaries thereof;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee on the question of the creation of the said district;

That the said referendum was hald within the said defined boundaries on the twenty-eighth day of March, 1941;

That the result of the said referendum showed that a majority of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the creation of the said district:

That thereafter on the third day of May, 1941, the State Soil Conservation

Committee did duly determine that the operation of the said district is administratively practicable and feasible;

That the boundaries of the said district were defined by the State Soil Conservation Committee as follows:

Including the townships of Chester, Gilford, Lake, Mt. Pleasant, Fepin, Mazeppa and Hyde Park in the county of Webasha; all those parts of the townships of Cakwood, Glasgow, West Albany, and Greenfield, county of Wabasha, which lie north of the Zumbro River; and the City of Webasha in the county of Wabasha; more specifically the boundaries are described as commencing at the point of junction of the south boundary of the township of Greenfield in Wabasha county with the west shoreline of the Mississippi River; thence in a northerly and westerly direction clong the west shoreline of the Mississippi River to the north boundary of Wabasha county; thence due west to the west boundary of Mt. Pleasant township; thence due south to the north boundary of Chester township; thence due west to the west boundary of Wabasha county; thence due south to the south boundary of Wabasha county; thence due east to the east boundary of Mazeppa township to the Zumbro River; and thence in a general easterly direction along the north shore of the Zumbro River to the south boundary of Greenfield township; and thence due east to the point of beginning.

There shall be exempted from the lands bounded by the above description all parts and parcels of lands used for burial, religious or school purposes; all tracts of lands in cities, villages or towns, which lands are used exclusively for habitation or business purposes other than farming; in rural or urban areas all tracts of lands of seven acres or less; and all tracts of lands of ten acres or less which are used exclusively as woodlots.



Whereas, John Ring, of the County of Wabasha, and William G. Greer, of the County of Wabasha, the duly appointed supervisors of the Lake Fepin Soil Conservation District, acting pursuant to the Minnesota Soil Conservation Districts Law, Chapter 441 of the Laws of Minnesota for 1937, approved April 26, 1937, have filed in this office an application, subscribed and sworn to by each of them before an officer authorized by Laws to take and certify oaths, setting forth:


- (I) That a petition for the creation of the district was filed with the State Soil Conservation Committee, pursuant to the provisions of the State Soil Conservation Districts Law, and the proceedings specified in said act were taken pursuant to such petition, that the said application was filed in order to complete the organization of the district as a governmental subdivision and a public body, corporate and politic, and that the State Committee has appointed them as supervisors;
- (2) THE NAME AND OFFICIAL RESIDENCE OF THE DISTRICT SUPERVISORS, TOGETHER WITH A CERTIFIED COPY OF THE APPOINT-MENTS EVIDENCING THEIR RIGHT TO OFFICE;

(3) THEIR TERM OF OFFICE;

(4) THE NAME VAICH IS PROPOSED FOR THE DISTRICT; AND

(5) THE LOCATION OF THE PRINCIPAL OFFICE OF THE SUPER-VISORS OF THE DISTRICT; AND

Whereas, a statement of the State Conservation Committee, ACCOMPANYING THE ABOVE-MENTIONED APPLICATION HAS BEEN FILED IN THIS OFFICE, SETTING FORTH THAT A PETITION FOR THE CREATION OF THE LAKE PEPIN SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT WAS FILED WITH THE STATE SOIL CONSERVATION COMMITTEE; THAT, AFTER DUE NOTICE A HEARING WAS MELD, AND THE COMMITTEE DULY DETER-MINED THAT THERE IS-NEED, IN THE INTEREST OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE, FOR A SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO FUNCTION IN THE PROPOSED TERRITORY, AND THAT THE COMMITTEE . DEFINED THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; THAT THEN, AFTER DUE NOTICE, A REFERENDUM WAS HELD ON THE QUESTION OF THE CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT, AND THE REQUETS OF THE SAID REFERENDUM SHOWED A MAJORITY OF THE VOTES CAST TO BE IN FAVOR OF THE CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT; AND THAT THEREAFTER THE COMMITTEE DID DULY DETERMINE THAT THE OPERATION OF THE PROPOSED DISTRICT IS ADMINISTRATIVELY PRACTICABLE AND FEASIBLE. SAID STATEMENT ALSO SET FORTH THE BOUNDARIES OF THE DISTRICT AS DEFINED BY



THE STATE COUNTTYPE.

Now, Therefore, I, Nike Holm, Secretary of State of the State of Ninnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Law, do hereby find, after examination of the application and statement referred to above, that the name proposed for said district is not identical with that of any other soil conservation district of this state or so nearly similar as to lead to confusion or uncertainty; and

I DO HEREBY CERTIFY THAT THE LAKE FEFIN SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT HAS BEEN DULY ORGANIZED AND CONSTITUTES A. GOVERN-MENTAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE AND A PUBLIC BODY, CORPO-BATE AND POLITIC, VESTED WITH ALL THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON SUCH DISTRICTS BY LAW.
