

ORDINANCE NUMBER. XIV.....

An ordinance passed by the Village of Lonsdale, Rice county Minnesota, in accordance with the laws governing elections to be held and providing for the detaching of villages from townships for all purposes.

The Village of Lonsdale, Rice County, Minnesota, ordains:

Section I. In accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota and this ordinance contained, the Village of Lonsdale, Rice county, Minnesota, having on the 25th day of January 1911 issued its notice of special election, citing the citizens of the Village of Lonsdale, County of Rice and State of Minnesota, who were qualified to vote at general elections that there would be held a special election in said Village of Lonsdale, Rice county, Minnesota, on Tuesday the 21st day of February 1911 between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day for the purpose of voting on the detaching of the Village of Lonsdale in Rice county, Minnesota, from the township of Wheatland, Rice county, Minnesota.

Section II. And at the election held in the old bank building in the Village of Lonsdale, Rice county, Minnesota on the 21st day of February 1911 for the purpose of voting on the question of detaching the Village of Lonsdale from the Township of Wheatland, the number of votes cast for and against said question were, as follows: For detaching forty-five votes, against detaching four votes; that the number of ballots received from the Village Recorder were sixty; that the number of ballots voted ^{were} forty-nine as certified to by the judges and clerk of election and as appears from the records of said election so held now on file in the office of the Village Recorder of the Village of Lonsdale, Rice county, Minnesota.

Section III. That hereafter in conformity to the laws of the State of Minnesota and by the authority vested in the Village Council of the Village of Lonsdale. The Village of Lonsdale is from and after the passage, approval and acceptance of this ordinance detached from the township of Wheatland, Rice county, Minnesota for all purposes.

Section IV. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
