


KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Section 114, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, and the written request of the Railroad and Warehouse Commission, do hereby constitute and appoint George T. Simpson of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as SPECIAL COUNSEL for the Railroad and Warehouse Commission, for the period commencing January 4, 1943, and to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law; the compensation of said George T. Simpson as such Special Counsel for the Railroad and Warehouse Commission to be paid from the appropriations made for the Railroad and Warehouse Commission for said purpose.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this 4th day of January, 1943.


