

TO THE HONORABLE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE  
OF ALICE, IN ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MINNESOTA;

THE UNDERSIGNED Represent and show to your Honorable Body that they are legal voters residing within the territory hereinafter described, and they respectfully petition your Honorable Body to have all of Sections eighteen and nineteen (18 & 19), west half of Section seventeen (W. 1/2 Sec. 17), west half of Section twenty (W. 1/2 Sec. 20), north half of the north half of Section thirty ( N. 1/2 N. 1/2 Sec. 30) and the north half of the northwest quarter of Section twenty-nine (N. 1/2 N. W. 1/4 Sec. 29), of Township fifty-eight, (58), Range twenty (20), in St. Louis County, Minnesota, annexed to the said Village of Alice to become a part thereof, and ask your Honorable Body to call an election for the qualified voters of said territory to determine such proposed annexation according to law.

Your petitioners further represent and show that said territory above described contains a population of more than seventy-five<sup>(75)</sup> persons, and is not included in any corporate city, or village, and that it adjoins the said Village of Alice, and that no part thereof is situate more than one and one-half miles from the present limits of the said Village of Alice, and that a part of said territory is platted into lots and blocks, streets and alleys, and has been sold and is now settled and occupied by a resident population as a village.

Your petitioners further show that there are Two thousand one hundred sixty (2160) acres of land embraced within the said territory they ask leave to have annexed to the said Village of Alice.

Your petitioners further show that they have caused to be taken a true and correct census of the resident population of said territory, which census was taken on the 13th day of March, A. D. 1911, and that the said resident population of said territory was found by said census to be and is ninety-four (94); and the said census, verified by the oaths of three of your petitioners, declaring that such census was accurately taken at the time aforesaid and that the statements within this petition are true, is hereto annexed and presented to you.

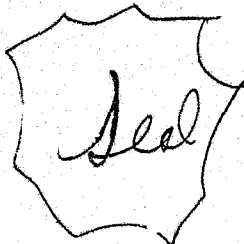

WE, GEO. E. WOODS, JOHN MOWAT and CHARLES LEFEBRE, do hereby certify that pursuant to the appointment of the Village Council of the Village of Alice, in St. Louis County, Minnesota, appointing us Inspectors of Election upon the question of the annexation of Sections eighteen and nineteen (18 and 19), west half of Section seventeen (W. 1/2 Sec. 17), west half of Section twenty (W. 1/2 Sec. 20), north half of the north half of Section thirty (N. 1/2 N. 1/2 Sec. 30), and north half of the northwest quarter of Section twenty-nine (N. 1/2 N. W. 1/4 Sec. 29), of Township fifty-eight (58), Range twenty (20), in St. Louis County, Minnesota, to the Village of Alice, we did, on the 21st day of March, A. D. 1911, post three copies of the annexed notice of said election, with a certified copy of the petition in said matter attached to such notice, at three public places in the territory aforesaid so proposed to be annexed, which notices were posted at the following places, to-wit:

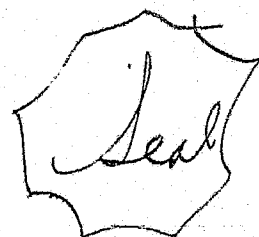

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A petition was presented for the annexation of certain territory to the Village of Alice, which said territory is described as follows, to-wit; All of Sections numbered eighteen and nineteen (18 and 19), west half of Section seventeen (Sec. 17), west half of Section twenty (W. 1/2 Sec. 20), north half of the north half of Section thirty (N. 1/2 N. 1/2 Sec. 30), and north half of the northwest quarter of Section twenty-nine (N. 1/2 N. W. 1/4 Sec. 29), of Township fifty-eight (58), Range twenty (20), in St. Louis County, Minnesota, and said petitioners request the Village Council to fix a time and place when and where the voters residing within said territory might vote for or against said annexation.

Trustee Charles Ellinger moved and introduced the following Resolution:

WHEREAS A certain petition for the annexation of the territory above described to the Village of Alice has been duly presented to the Village Council of the Village of Alice, it being shown by said petition that it is desired to annex certain tracts of land in said county not already incorporated nor a part of any village or city, to-wit; Sections numbered eighteen and nineteen (18 and 19), west half of Section seventeen (W. 1/2 Sec. 17), west half of Section twenty (W. 1/2 Sec. 20), north half of the north half of Section thirty (N. 1/2 N. 1/2 Sec. 30), and north half of the northwest quarter of Section twenty-nine (N. 1/2 N. W. 1/4 Sec. 29), of Township fifty-eight (58), Range twenty (20), in St. Louis County, Minnesota, and;

WHEREAS It is further shown by said petition, among other things, that a census of said territory so proposed to be incorporated has been duly taken and that said census discloses a population of more than seventy-five (75), to-wit, a population of \_\_\_\_\_ persons residing upon said territory so proposed to be annexed, and;

WHEREAS It appears to this Council that said territory adjoins the Village of Alice, and that no part of said territory is within the corporate limits of any city or village and that none of said territory is more than one and one-half miles from the present limits of the Village of Alice, and;

WHEREAS It is further shown that said petition has been duly signed by the required number of voters residing within said territory and that all the requirements of the statute in such case made and provided have been duly complied with on the part of the said petitioners, and in the instance of their said petition; now therefore, after duly considering said petition and all the facts in connection therewith,

BE IT, and IT HEREBY IS RESOLVED, That said petition be approved and the prayer thereof be granted, and further, that the election prayed for in said petition be and the same is hereby ordered to be held on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 1911, at and in the ground floor room of that certain building known as the \_\_\_\_\_ Building, situate on \_\_\_\_\_ in that portion of the territory herein described, platted and known as the plat of \_\_\_\_\_, the said building being a structure within the limits of said territory so proposed to be annexed. be, and they are hereby appointed as inspectors, who shall act as judges of said election and direct the same as far as practicable according to the laws regulating the election of town officers, all of which inspectors, or persons appointed as such inspectors, are residents upon said territory, and are among those who signed said petition for such annexation. That the recorder of the Village of Alice, be, and he is hereby directed to cause proper notices of such petition to be made and the same to be posted in three public places within the boundaries of the territory described in said petition and proposed to be annexed, together with a notice attached to each of said copies, and which said notice shall state the time and place pursuant to the determination of the Village Council of the Village of Alice as to said time and place made by this Resolution.

RESOLUTION BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF ALICE,  
TO RECEIVE PETITION FOR THE ADDING OF TERRITORY TO THE VILLAGE OF  
ALICE, AND FIX THE TIME AND PLACE FOR HOLDING AN ELECTION WITHIN SUCH  
TERRITORY, AS IS DESCRIBED IN SAID PETITION, AND TO APPOINT THREE  
INSPECTORS, RESIDENTS OF SAID TERRITORY, TO ACT AS JUDGES OF SAID  
ELECTION.

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WHEREAS, The Village Council has been petitioned by eleven (11)  
legal voters, residing within the territory described as follows: Sec-  
tions eighteen and nineteen (18 & 19) and the West half of Section seven-  
teen (17); the West half of Section twenty (20); North half of the North  
half of Section thirty (30); North half of the Northwest wuarter of Sec-  
tion twenty-nine (29); Township fifty-eight (58) North, Range twenty  
(20) West, in St. Louis County, Minnesota, lying adjacent to the Vil-  
lage of Alice and all of said territory lying and being within a mile  
and a half of the Village limits of the Village of Alice, having a  
residence population of ninety-four (94), said territory comprising  
two thousand one hundred and sixty (2,160) acres of land, and said pe-  
tition is verified by the oath of three (3) of the petitioners, declar-  
ing that the census was actually taken, as set forth in the petition,  
within four (4) weeks of the time of the filing of said petition, and  
that the statements within said petition are true.

Resolved that the Village Council of the Village of Alice receive  
said petition and cause a copy thereof with a notice attached thereto,  
fixing the time and place for holding the election, be posted in three  
(3) public places in such territory, calling for an election to be held  
at Geo. E. Wood's residence on the 1st day of April, 1911, after such  
posting, and within the limits of such territory. That G. E. Woods,  
C. M. Curtis and Chas. Lefebvre be appointed as three (3) inspectors,  
residents of said territory, who shall act as Judges of said election  
and conduct the same after the provision of chapter One hundred and  
thirteen (113) of the Laws of Minnesota of the year 1909, and make  
returns to the Village Council of the Village of Alice of the results  
of said election immediately after such election, inspection and can-  
vass of the ballots, and forth-with file with the Village Clerk of Alice,

stating the time and place of holding said election, that they be  
canvassed, the ballots cast thereat and the number cast for and a-  
gainst said proposition and verify said certificate under oath to  
the effect that the statements therein are true.
