I have just received a communication from the Czechoslovak Embassy in Washington with the enclosed envelope addressed to the "Slovakian Consul", Washington, D. C. with the request that I inform you that the United States Government has never recognized the formation or existence of a so-called "Slovakia" but on the other hand has, since July 30, 1941, officially recognized the Czechoslovak officials of the Czechoslovak Government now in London.
