PROCLAMATION

AT THE STATE OF MINNESOTA
IN THE CITY OF ST. PAUL
ON APRIL 10, 1943
BY GOVERNOR HAROLD E. STASSEN
AND SIGNED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

W.H.S.

WHEREAS, the health and welfare of all children is ever vital to the strength of the nation, and

WHEREAS, at this time many teen aged boys and girls are assuming essential war responsibilities on farms, in factories, stores and offices, and

WHEREAS, a national effort is being made this year to protect the health of these young workers,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold E. Stassen, Governor of the State of Minnesota,
do hereby proclaim and designate

May 1, 1943

as

CHILD HEALTH DAY

and urge all citizens and interested agencies to coordinate their efforts with duly authorized officials directing health, education, labor employment and welfare programs to continue important measures to safeguard all children in wartime and to make special efforts to protect the health, normal growth, and development of the expanding army of young workers for victory.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in Saint Paul this twenty-sixth day of April, 1943.
