We, the undersigned, the duly appointed, qualified and acting Judges and Clerk of a special election held in the Village of Hackensack, Cass County, Minnesota, on the 22nd day of April, 1911, pursuant to notice of special Village election, a copy of which is hereto attached, which said notice was duly posted according to law, do hereby certify that at said special election fifteen votes were cast in favor of, and one vote against, the proposition set forth in said notice of election, to-wit: the proposition of separating said Village of Hackensack from the Town of Birch Lake, and making said Village of Hackensack a separate election and assessment district. We further certify that after canvassing the votes cast at said election, we proclaimed that said proposition had carried.
