

EXECUTIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, I have been duly requested by an authorized representative of the President of the United States to formulate speed regulations for vehicles using streets and highways of the State of Minnesota, and


WHEREAS, in order to conserve essential materials, Joseph B. Eastman, Director of Defense Transportation, has duly issued an order limiting the speed of motor vehicles driven or operated within the continental limits of the United States to a rate of speed not to exceed thirty-five miles per hour, and which said order became effective throughout the United States on the first day of October, 1942,

NOW THEN, pursuant to authority vested in me by Chapter 252 of the Session Laws of Minnesota for 1943, I do hereby formulate and issue a regulation concerning and limiting the speed of motor vehicles using the streets and highways of the State of Minnesota outside the corporate limits of any city, village or borough in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

No person shall drive any vehicle on any road or highway of the State of Minnesota outside the corporate limits of any city, village or borough at a rate of speed in excess of thirty-five miles per hour.

Let a copy hereof be forthwith filed in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota.
