

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8 Gentlemen:-

9 We, the undersigned, more than twenty-five legal  
10 voters residing within the territory and upon the land described  
11 herein, do hereby petition your honorable board to call an elect-  
12 ion for the determination of the incorporation of the proposed  
13 village of ZEMPEL, said proposed village and incorporation to  
14 include the following described lands and territory:

15 Lots one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5),  
16 six (6), seven (7) and Eight (8) and the Southeast quarter of  
17 Northeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section one (1), and Lots one  
18 (1) and eleven (11), of Section two (2), all in Township one  
19 hundred forty-four (144) North, Range twenty-five (25) West of  
20 Fifth Principal Meridian, in said Itasca County, Minnesota,  
21 including all of Lakeview Addition to Itasca City, in said  
22 Itasca county, according to the plat thereof on file or of re-  
23 cord in the office of the register of deeds in and for said  
24 county.

25 Your petitioners have caused to be taken on the  
26 twenty-eighth day of April, 1911, an accurate census of the  
27 resident population of the said territory proposed to be in-  
28 cluded in said village and in said incorporation, which census  
29 was taken by H. Zempel, Ed Staten and Ole Dargh, legal voters  
30 and residents of the lands and within the territory above  
31 described, and to be included within said proposed incorporation;  
32 and the persons so taking said census are among the petitioners  
33 whose signatures are hereto attached.

34 That a statement of said census so taken as aforesaid,  
35 setting forth accurately the names of the inhabitants, actual  
residents of the lands and territory above described, is hereto  
attached marked Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

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4 The boundaries of the territory proposed to be incorpo-  
5 rated as said village are as above set forth, to-wit: the boundar-  
6 ies of the entire group of governmental subdivisions of land above  
7 described; and the quantity of land embraced therein is four  
8 hundred thirty and 61/100 (430.61) acres.

9 That said lands include nineteen and 95/100 (19.95)  
10 acres of platted lands; that said platted lands have been duly  
11 platted into lots and blocks, as "Lakeview Addition to Itasca  
12 City;" and the plat thereof has been duly and legally certified,  
13 according to the laws of the State of Minnesota, and filed and  
14 recorded in the office of the register of deeds for said Itasca  
15 County; that all of said lands lie in Itasca County; that the  
16 descriptions of the lands above referred to as platted lands  
17 are as follows:

18 The lands platted as "Lakeview Addition to Itasca  
19 City", described and bounded as follows: That part of lot three  
20 (3) in section one (1) in township one hundred forty-four  
21 (144), north of range twenty-five (25), west of 5th P. M.,  
22 according to the government survey, commencing at an iron  
23 monument on the township line between said section one (1) and  
24 and section thirty-six (36) in township one hundred forty-five  
25 (145), north, of range twenty-five (25), west, 1324 feet east  
26 of the northwest corner of said section one (1), thence in a  
27 southerly direction at an angle of 88 degrees and 33 minutes  
28 660 feet, thence in an easterly direction at an angle of 91  
29 degrees and 32 minutes 1317 feet, thence in a northerly  
30 direction at an angle of 88 degrees and 32 minutes 660 feet  
31 to the quarter post on the north side of said section one (1),  
32 thence in a westerly direction at an angle of 91 degrees and  
33 32 minutes 1317 feet to the place of beginning;-

34 That the unplatted portion of the territory hereinabove  
35 described and proposed to be included in said incorporation  
adjoins the platted portion thereof, above described and is so

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conditioned as properly to be subjected to village government.

That the actual number of the actual residents on all of the territory above described, proposed to be included in said village and incorporation is Two hundred and fifteen (215); that the number of actual residents on the platted portions thereof above described is twenty-three (23) and that the resident population of all of said territory so proposed to be incorporated is not more than three thousand (3000) nor less than two hundred.

That none of the lands or territory above described is already incorporated, nor is any part thereof within the limits of any incorporated village, city or borough.

That the undersigned petitioners are all actual residents and legal voters of said territory.

That the name of the proposed village is ZEMPEL.

Wherefore, your petitioners ask that your honorable board proceed according to law to call an election for the determination of such proposed incorporation of said village of Zempel, and that you take all the steps and proceedings required by law for such purpose.

"Whereas, Ed Staten and thirty-four other persons, legal voters within the territory hereinafter described, have made and filed with the county auditor, as clerk of this board, a petition, signed by them, which petition has been presented to this board, setting forth, among other things, that said petitioners are legal voters residing within the following described territory, to wit: Lots one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5), six (6), seven (7) and eight (8) and the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section one (1), and lots one (1) and eleven (11) of section two (2), all in township one-hundred forty-four (144) north, of range twenty-five (25), west of 5th P.M., in Itasca county, Minnesota, including all of Lakeview Addition to Itasca City, in said Itasca county, according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the register of deeds of said county;— ~~xxxxxxx~~ that said petitioners have caused to be taken by three of them on the 28th day of April, 1911, an accurate census of the persons residing on the territory before described, a statement of which census is attached to said petition and made a part thereof; that a description and the boundaries of said territory proposed to be incorporated as a village are as above set forth and the quantity of land embraced therein is 430.61 acres; that said lands include 19.95 acres of platted lands duly platted as "Lakeview Addition to Itasca City", which is divided into lots and blocks and is more particularly described in the petition, and that the plat thereof has been duly and legally certified according to the laws of this state and filed in the office of the register of deeds of this county; that the unplatted lands of said territory adjoin the platted portions thereof and is so constituted as properly to be subject to village government; that the actual number of residents on all of said territory is 215, and that the number thereof does not exceed 3000 and is not less than 300; that none

of said territory is already incorporated, nor is any part thereof within the limits of any incorporated city, village or borough; that it is proposed and desired to incorporate all of the territory above described as a village and that the name of said proposed village is "Zempel",- and praying that this board proceed according to law to call an election for the determination of such proposed incorporation and take all steps and proceedings required by law for such purpose,- which petition was duly verified by three of said petitioners, declaring such census was accurately taken on the day specified and that the statements contained in the petition are true:

"And, whereas, this board, after duly considering said matter, is of the opinion and does hereby determine that the contents of said petition are true and that it is expedient and for the best interests of the residents of said territory that said petition be granted and that an election should be called and held for the determination of such proposed incorporation and that all further steps and proceedings be taken as required by law for such purpose:

"Now, therefore, be it resolved that said petition and the whole thereof be granted, and it is hereby approved; that the 25<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1911, between the hour of 10 o'clock A.M., at which time the polls shall open, and 4 o'clock P.M., at which time the same shall close, and the frame building known as the Deer River Lumber Company office situated on lot 4 in section 1 in township 144, range 25, in said county, within the boundaries of said proposed territory proposed to be incorporated, be, and the same hereby are fixed as the time and place for holding an election of the legal voters residing within said territory for the purpose of determining whether said territory shall be so incorporated as the Village of Zempel; that an election be so held at said time and place as before specified, and that the county

auditor is hereby authorized and directed to issue and cause to be posted in three of the most public places within said territory,- there being no newspaper published within the same,- not less than twenty nor more than thirty days prior to the day so fixed for said election, a notice of the same, specifying and fixing the time and place thereof as aforesaid, and containing all the details required by law, including a specification of the purpose of said election, and a description of the territory proposed to be incorporated, together with a copy of said petition, attached to said notice.

"Be it further resolved that Ed Staten,  
N. D. Zetterstrom and William Martindale,  
legal voters and residents of the territory proposed to be incorporated, be, and they hereby are, appointed inspectors, to act as judges of said election, conduct the same according to law, make due return of their proceedings, and to perform all other duties by law required of them."

You are hereby notified that a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Itasca County, Minnesota, on the 4th of May, 1911, you were duly appointed by said board inspectors, to act as judges of an election of the legal voters residing within the territory hereinafter described, on the 25th day of May, 1911, between the hours of ten o'clock, A.
