I, M. A. Spang, as county auditor of Itasca county, do hereby certify, under the provisions of Chapter 154 of General Laws of the State of Minnesota, 1911, that there has been certified to me the result of an election duly held in the Village of Zempel, in said county, on the 27th day of June, 1911, to vote upon and determine the following question:

"Shall the Village of Zempel, in Itasca county, Minnesota, be separated from the Town of Otengagen, of which it is now a part, for election and assessment purposes and be constituted a separate election and assessment district?"

to wit: That the qualified voters and electors of said village, voting upon said question at said election, voted by a majority vote (twenty-nine votes being in favor of said proposition, and one votes being against said proposition), in favor of said proposition.

I transmit to you duplicates of such papers as have been certified to me certifying the results of said election.
