PETITION FOR INCORPORATION OF VILLAGE

To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of
Hennepin, Minnesota:

The undersigned, 33 voters, two year residents of the territory
hereinafter described hereby petition your honorable board to
fix a time and place when and where the resident voters may vote
on the proposition of incorporating such territory as a village
under the Revised Laws of 1905, as amended, to be known by the
name of Medicine Lake. The territory proposed to be incorporated
is described as follows: Medicine Lake Park 1st Division
Blocks 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11

Such territory consists of lands which have been wholly platted
into lots and blocks, which plat has been duly and legally cer-
tified according to the laws of this state and has been filed in
the office of the register of deeds of Hennepin County, the
county in which said lands lie. Such territory contains 92 acres
(more or less) of land and has 154 actual residents thereon, as
has been duly ascertained by a census taken under our direction
on the 19th day of February, year 1944 as appears by the
verification hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the 28th day of March, 1944, between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. be, and is hereby fixed as the time, and that certain building known as the Charles T. Boenar Garage located on Lots 2 and 3, Block 6, Medicine Lake Park First Division, Hennepin County, Minnesota, within the territory described in said petition, as the place where an election shall be held to determine whether or not the territory described in said petition shall be incorporated as the Village of Medicine Lake;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Lester B. Johantgen, A. L. Gahly and James R. Solberg be, and are hereby appointed inspectors who shall preside and act as judges at said election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Lester B. Johantgen be, and is hereby designated and appointed to post in three of the most public places in said territory, a copy of said petition with notice attached, stating the time and place, when and where the electors thereof will vote for or against such incorporation.
