CERTIFICATE OF AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF WORTHINGTON

I, H.O. Kragness, Mayor of the City of Worthington in the County of Nobles and State of Minnesota, do hereby certify:

l. That under date of the 3d day of February, 1944, the Board of Freeholders of said City duly submitted to me the following proposed amendments to the Charter of the City of Worthington, to-wit:

Amendment No. 1

That Section 39 of said Charter be amended to read as follows:"Sec. 39. The Assessor must be a resident and elector in the city for at least two (2) years immediately preceding his appointment and shall be appointed for a two (2) year term commencing on the first secular day of January in each odd numbered year. He shall by and with the consent and approval of the Council appoint such deputies as may be required to enable him to properly perform the duties of his office, and he may discharge such deputies at will. He shall be appointed in December of the even numbered years.

The term of the assessor and his deputies who may be in office at the time this amendment takes effect shall expire on the first secular day of January, 1945."

Amendment No. 2

That Section 53 be amended to read as follows: - ec. 53. The Council shall appoint three residents

"Sec. 53. The Council shall appoint three residents and electors of said City to act as Park Commissioners, such appointment being in the manner and for the term as follows, to-wit: At the Annual Meeting in the year 1945, the Council shall appoint on commissioner for a one (1) year term, one Commissioner for a two (2) year term and one commissioner for a three (3) year term. Thereafter and as the term of office of each commissioner expires the Council shall appoint each commissioner for a three (3) year term. The Commissioners shall have such powers and perform such duties as the Council may direct, and shall receive such compensation as the Council may determine."

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
