WHEREAS, the sustaining love and sacrifice of "Mother" shines a beacon through this battle haze and strengthens our faith in those rights and liberties which were ours from birth and for which we fight to preserve for our children, and

WHEREAS, by Act of Congress the display of the American Flag is directed on all government buildings on the second Sunday of May in observance of Mother's Day,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim


SUNDAY, May 14, 1944,
