PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has designated May 1 as Child Health Day, and invited the boys and girls of the nation to use this occasion to gather with parents, teachers, and other citizens or by themselves to consider how we can improve health conditions in our homes and communities, and

WHEREAS, the young people of Minnesota are eager to accept the responsibility of helping to improve health conditions in the state,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim and designate


May 1, 1944

as

CHILD HEALTH DAY


and urge that Minnesota boys and girls organize public forums, prepare programs for presentation in their schools, churches, and other community centers for the purpose of determining ways and means of promoting better health conditions in Minnesota. And, further, I urge the boys and girls in every community in the state to plan one useful project which they can undertake in the coming year to improve health conditions in their own community.
