TO THE HONORABLE THE COUNTY BOARD OF THE COUNTY OF CLAY IN THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

We, the undersigned, voters residing upon the land and within the territory hereinafter described, respectfully petition your honorable body, that you do appoint, in conformity with the statutes of this state in such case made and provided, a time and place when and where the voters residing within said territory, platted and otherwise may vote for and against the incorporation of the same into the proposed village hereinafter named.

Your petitioners represent and declare that said territory hereinafter described has been partly platted into lots with a view to village occupancy, and the unplatted part of such territory adjoins the platted portion and is so conditioned as properly to be subjected to village government; and that said lands and premises are not included within the boundaries of any incorporated town, city or village, nor is any part thereof so included.

Your petitioners further represent and declare that they have ascertained by a census duly taken under their direction, the resident population actually residing upon the lands and territory hereinafter described, platted and unplatted; that the number of persons actually residing there on on the 29th day of May, A. D. 1911, was 594.


